18 include four grandchildren, two great-grandchildren, and one
19 great-great-grandchild; and

20 WHEREAS, Charles Grubbs enjoyed a life that was rich in the
21 intangibles that matter most, and he is deeply missed by all those
22 who held him dear; now, therefore, be it
