3 of Diane Price of Richardson, who passed away on December 27, 2010,
4 at the age of 78; and

5 WHEREAS, Mrs. Price was born on June 2, 1932, in Moline,
6 Illinois, to Suzanne and Kenneth Hartman; a gifted student, she
7 graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Vassar College, where she earned a
8 bachelor's degree in economics; and

9 WHEREAS, After working for an executive recruiting firm in
10 New York City, Mrs. Price moved to Richardson in 1967 and joined the
11 staff of Collins Radio, which was later acquired by Rockwell
12 International; accomplished in her work, she earned a number of
13 promotions through the years, retiring as a program manager in the
14 defense communications systems division; and

15 WHEREAS, Actively engaged in her community, Mrs. Price gave
16 freely of her time and talents to a number of worthwhile
17 organizations, including the advisory boards of the Dallas Ballet,
18 Richardson Hospital, Promenade Bank, Richardson Symphony, and
19 Network of Community Ministries; she also held a number of
20 leadership positions, serving as president of Altrusa
21 International of Richardson, the YWCA of Metropolitan Dallas, and
22 the Richardson Chamber of Commerce; and

23 WHEREAS, Mrs. Price further served on the selection board for
24 the president of The University of Texas at Dallas, and she was

1 instrumental in the establishment of Leadership Richardson; in
2 1986, her exceptional efforts in behalf of the community were
3 recognized when she was named Citizen of the Year; and

4 WHEREAS, A loving wife and mother as well, she shared 30 years
5 with her husband, Jim, and she was devoted to their blended family,
6 which included her son, Shaun, and her stepchildren, Richard,
7 Pamela, David, and Steven; in her free time, she enjoyed traveling,
8 tennis, and golf; and

9 WHEREAS, Diane Price brightened immeasurably the world
10 around her, and her remarkable talent, her generosity of spirit,
11 and her unwavering dedication to her loved ones will long be
12 remembered by those fortunate enough to know her; now, therefore,
