1           WHEREAS, U.S. Army Colonel Pamela A. DeLancy has served her  
2 nation with distinction for more than three decades; and

3           WHEREAS, Colonel DeLancy entered the army in September 1980  
4 as an enlisted soldier; she completed basic training at Fort  
5 Jackson, South Carolina, and served four years before leaving the  
6 military to attend the University of Houston; in her junior year of  
7 college, she joined the Reserve Officer Training Corps and went on  
8 to graduate from the Airborne School at Fort Benning, Georgia, as an  
9 ROTC cadet; she received an early commission in 1987 and accepted an  
10 army reserve assignment as a documentation officer in the 348th  
11 Transportation Battalion; and

12           WHEREAS, After earning a bachelor's degree in nursing from  
13 The University of Texas Health Science Center in 1989, Colonel  
14 DeLancy entered active duty as an officer in the Army Nurse Corps;  
15 she served as a medical-surgical nurse at Fort Bliss, Texas, and as  
16 an emergency room nurse at Fort Stewart, Georgia, and then left  
17 active duty to work for four years as a medical-surgical nurse at  
18 the 4005th U.S. Army Hospital in Houston; and

19           WHEREAS, Colonel DeLancy subsequently became an active guard  
20 reserve soldier stationed with the army's Recruiting Command at  
21 Fort Knox, Kentucky; she went on to serve in such positions as  
22 quality assurance manager for clinical affairs and medical  
23 credentialing for the South East Regional Command, chief of  
24 credentialing at the U.S. Army Medical Department Professional

1 Management Command, and nurse administrator in the surgeon's office  
2 at 63D Regional Support Command; along the way, she obtained her  
3 master's degree in health administration from Central Michigan  
4 University; and

5 WHEREAS, Most recently, this outstanding officer was  
6 selected to attend the prestigious War College, the army's highest  
7 institution of professional development for strategic leaders; she  
8 is slated to graduate with the Class of 2012; and

9 WHEREAS, Colonel DeLancy's achievements have been recognized  
10 with the Meritorious Service Medal with three oak leaf clusters,  
11 the Army Commendation Medal with two oak leaf clusters, the Army  
12 Achievement Medal with three oak leaf clusters, the Good Conduct  
13 Medal, the Armed Forces Reserve Medal, and the Global War on  
14 Terrorism Service Medal, among many others; and

15 WHEREAS, Throughout her career, Colonel DeLancy has  
16 benefited from the love and support of her husband, Barnes DeLancy,  
17 as well as her two daughters, Tori and Tamara; and

18 WHEREAS, Colonel Pamela DeLancy has contributed immeasurably  
19 to advancing the mission of every organization of which she has been  
20 a part, and her exemplary efforts in behalf of the nation are indeed  
21 deserving of praise; now, therefore, be it

22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas  
23 Legislature hereby honor Colonel Pamela A. DeLancy for her  
24 distinguished military service and extend to her sincere best
