## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, A full and generous life drew to a close with the 2 death of Clayton Eugene Reynolds of North Richland Hills on 3 February 14, 2011, at the age of 83; and

WHEREAS, Gene Reynolds was born in Arlington on April 19, 1927; on graduating from Handley High School in 1943, he answered his nation's call to duty and enlisted in the U.S. Navy; he shipped out aboard the USS *Nashville* on his 17th birthday; and

WHEREAS, Following his discharge from the armed forces, 8 9 Mr. Reynolds went to work with the Texas Highway Department as a surveyor; in 1950, he joined the Texas Bitulithic Company, where he 10 11 earned a steady series of promotions, becoming manager of the Fort 12 Worth Division in 1965, vice president of Texas Bitulithic in 1974, and president of Gulf Bitulithic Company in 1977; after retiring 13 14 from the latter post in 1982, he partnered with his son Gary to develop Reynolds Asphalt and Construction Company, serving as vice 15 president and chief consultant; he was active in the Associated 16 General Contractors of Texas and the Texas Good Roads and 17 Transportation Association, and he sat on the board of directors 18 for the Texas Hot Mix Asphalt Pavement Association; and 19

20 WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan was an ordained deacon and a 21 valued congregant of North Fort Worth Baptist Church; in addition, 22 he was a Master Mason with the Handley Masonic Lodge and the Fort 23 Worth Scottish Rite, as well as an honorary life member of the 24 Moslah Shrine Motor Corps and a past president of its Golf Unit;

1 moreover, he was a life member and Ceremonial Master of the Royal 2 Order of Jesters Fort Worth Court No. 32; Mr. Reynolds took a 3 special interest in helping the children at the Masonic Home and 4 School in Fort Worth; and

5 WHEREAS, Gene Reynolds shared a rewarding marriage of 62 6 years with his wife, Jane; they wed in 1948 and were blessed with 7 three children, Terry, Gary, and Rodney, as well as three 8 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren; in his free time, he 9 enjoyed playing golf and traveling with his wife; and

10 WHEREAS, While the death of Gene Reynolds brings great 11 sadness to his family and friends, he leaves behind a rich legacy of 12 achievement that will long be treasured by all those who held him 13 dear; now, therefore, be it
