1           WHEREAS, Family and friends are mourning the loss of Jo Ann  
2 Darden of Waco, who passed away on April 21, 2011, at the age of 78;  
3 and

4           WHEREAS, Born on October 6, 1932, in Woodville to  
5 Stephen B. Owens and Margaret Allie Owens, the former Jo Ann Owens  
6 graduated from high school in Beaumont in 1949 and then attended  
7 Lamar University, earning her degree in 1953; while in high school  
8 and college, she was a member of the notable singing group the  
9 Melody Maids, traveling to numerous military bases as well as New  
10 York and Mexico City to perform and also taking part in the opening  
11 ceremonies for the Shamrock Hotel in Houston; and

12           WHEREAS, She met the love of her life, Robert F. Darden, Jr.,  
13 while in college, and the two were married in 1953, five days after  
14 he received his United States Air Force commission; with her  
15 husband, Mrs. Darden soon left for Schilling Air Force Base in  
16 Kansas, and they spent a total of 58 years together while residing  
17 in Alabama, California, Washington, Virginia, Japan, and Texas and  
18 welcoming three children, Robert, Steven, and Danni; and

19           WHEREAS, A devoted homemaker and mother, Mrs. Darden loved to  
20 cook for her family, who especially enjoyed her shrimp gumbo,  
21 cornbread dressing, chicken enchiladas, and potato salad; she was a  
22 skilled piano player with a remarkable ability to play a piece after  
23 hearing it just once, and she also took pleasure in decorating,  
24 gardening, and caring for her dogs; and

1           WHEREAS, This industrious Texan found time over the course of  
2 her busy life to teach remedial math in public schools and work in  
3 an elementary school library; after coming to Waco, she assisted  
4 with student registration at Baylor University and served as a  
5 dormitory mother at the school, became a part of the Waco Center for  
6 Youth's public responsibility committee, and cooked for more than  
7 two decades for the Seventh and James Baptist Church's Meals on  
8 Wheels program; in addition, she was a member of the Philanthropic  
9 Educational Organization, which supports education for women; and

10           WHEREAS, Strong in her faith, Mrs. Darden was a member of the  
11 Columbus Avenue Baptist Church in Waco and participated in the  
12 Friendship Sunday school class; she sang with the Columbus Avenue  
13 church's Singing Saints and also in the Baylor University Senior  
14 Choir, and she hosted a women's weekly Bible study group; and

15           WHEREAS, Those fortunate enough to have known Jo Ann Darden  
16 will long remember her for her joyful and compassionate spirit, and  
17 although she will be greatly missed, her legacy will live on in the  
18 hearts of the many people whose lives she touched; now, therefore,  
19 be it

20           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas  
21 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of Jo Ann Darden and  
22 extend sincere sympathy to the members of her family: to her
