WHEREAS, A life dedicated to the pursuit of knowledge came to
an end with the death of eminent scientist and professor F. Gordon
A. Stone of Waco on April 6, 2011, at the age of 85; and

WHEREAS, Gordon Stone was born on May 9, 1925, in Exeter, England; he studied chemistry at Cambridge University, earning his bachelor's degree in 1948 and his doctorate in 1952, and he went on to serve as a postdoctoral assistant at the University of Southern California under the Fulbright Program; he subsequently joined the faculty of the chemistry department at Harvard University, attaining the rank of assistant professor; and

11 WHEREAS, In the early 1960s, Dr. Stone returned to England to 12 accept a post as the first chair of inorganic chemistry at Bristol 13 University, and his career there spanned nearly three decades; he 14 continued his teaching and research at Baylor University, which he 15 joined in 1990 as the Robert A. Welch Distinguished Professor of 16 Chemistry, before retiring at the age of 85 in 2010; and

WHEREAS, An internationally recognized expert in the field of organometallic chemistry, Professor Stone coauthored more than 750 primary scientific articles and gave lectures around the globe; he was named one of the 100 most cited chemists in the world by the Institute for Scientific Information; and

WHEREAS, Professor Stone was elected to the Royal Society, London, in 1976, and in 1990 he was made a Commander of the Order of the British Empire by Queen Elizabeth; in addition, he earned the

1 highest awards of the major academic chemical societies in Britain 2 and the United States, and he received a number of honorary degrees 3 from universities in Europe and North America; the American 4 Chemical Society published his scientific autobiography, *Leaving* 5 *No Stone Unturned*, in 1993; and

6 WHEREAS, This esteemed gentleman enjoyed the love and support 7 of his wife, the former Judith Hislop, for 52 years until her death 8 in 2008; together they were blessed with three sons, James, Peter, 9 and Derek, as well as seven grandchildren; and

10 WHEREAS, When not traveling the world, Professor Stone and 11 his wife divided their time between their homes in Bristol, 12 England, and Waco; the couple were renowned for their warmth and 13 hospitality, frequently hosting guests for a meal or an overnight 14 stay; and

15 WHEREAS, Gordon Stone lived a life of extraordinary 16 achievement, and he leaves behind a legacy that will continue to 17 inspire all those who were privileged to know him; now, therefore, 18 be it

19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas 20 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of F. Gordon A. Stone 21 and extend sincere condolences to his family: to his sons, James, 22 Peter, and Derek Stone; to his seven grandchildren; and to his other 23 relatives and friends; and, be it further
