1 WHEREAS, A full and generous life drew to a close with the
2 death of Teddy A. Klein of Tomball on May 6, 2011, at the age of 87;
3 and

4 WHEREAS, Teddy Klein was born in Spring on December 9, 1923,
5 to Alex and Rosa Klein; he graduated from Tomball High School and
6 The University of Texas at Austin, where he was a member of the Navy
7 ROTC, served as president of the Phi Kappa Sigma fraternity, and was
8 part of Beta Gamma Sigma, the University Men's Glee Club, the Silver
9 Spurs, and the Longhorn Band; and

10 WHEREAS, Following his graduation, Mr. Klein was
11 commissioned as an officer in the U.S. Navy, serving for 18 months
12 during World War II; he was a gunnery officer on Admiral William
13 Halsey's flagship, the USS *New Jersey* BB-62, and participated in
14 the Iwo Jima and Okinawa campaigns; and

15 WHEREAS, Along with his beloved wife, Leora Klein, who
16 preceded him in death, he owned Klein Funeral Homes and Memorial
17 Parks, a business that had been founded by his father; widely
18 respected by his peers, he was a member of the board of the National
19 Selected Morticians; his civic contributions included service as
20 president of the Tomball Chamber of Commerce and Rotary Club and as
21 a member of the Tomball Independent School District Board of
22 Trustees; in recognition of his accomplishments, he was honored as
23 Tomball Citizen of the Year in 1971; and

24 WHEREAS, Mr. Klein was a lifelong member of the Lutheran

1 faith; he was a former chair of Zion Lutheran Church and belonged to
2 the board of elders at Salem Lutheran Church; in addition, he was a
3 member of the board of missions of the Texas District of the
4 Lutheran Church, the Lutheran Hospital Board of Houston, and the
5 Good Samaritan Lutheran Home board, which he helped to found; and

6 WHEREAS, A devoted family man as well as an admired business
7 and community leader, Teddy Klein will be deeply missed, and
8 memories of his kind and generous nature will be forever cherished
9 by all who knew and loved him; now, therefore, be it

11 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Teddy A. Klein and
12 extend sincere condolences to the members of his family: to his
