1 WHEREAS, Rebecca Powers, founder of Impact Austin, retired as 2 executive director of the noteworthy philanthropic organization in 3 January 2011; and WHEREAS, In 2003, Ms. Powers established Impact Austin for 4 5 women seeking to transform lives in the community through targeted, lifelong giving; within six months, she had recruited 126 women to 6 7 join the organization, and the membership has since grown to more than 500; over the past eight years, Impact Austin has awarded over 8 9 \$3 million to worthy causes in its five focus areas: culture, environment, family, education, and health and wellness; Ms. Powers 10 11 has also worked to engage the next generation of women in 12 philanthropy through Impact Austin's youth initiative, Girls Giving Grants; formed in 2005 for students in grades 8-12, it has 13 14 awarded more than \$25,000 to community groups; and WHEREAS, A native of Louisville, Kentucky, Ms. Powers earned 15 16 her bachelor's degree in business administration at the University of Richmond in Virginia; she was employed as a sales representative 17 for IBM for 14 years before settling in Austin with her husband; 18 while her two children were in school, she was active in the PTA and 19 served as president for several years, and she cofounded a women's 20 21 Bible study group; she has also served on the boards of Trinity Center and the Rotary Club of Austin and is a graduate of Leadership 22 23 Austin; currently, she serves on the national board of the Jeremiah

Program and the alumni board of the University of Richmond; the
