WHEREAS, With its iconic mural of Cesar Chavez on an exterior wall, Rabbit's soon became a regular gathering place for political activists; among the elected officials whose campaigns used the lounge as a center of operations were John Trevino, Austin's first Hispanic city council member, Richard Moya, the first Mexican American Travis County commissioner, and State Senator Gonzalo Barrientos; and

WHEREAS, Rabbit's Lounge also became known through the years for its biennial sine die festivities, at which members of the legislature and their staff celebrated the end of the legislative session; and

WHEREAS, This beloved institution has greatly contributed to the political and cultural legacy of East Austin, and Rabbit Duran may take justifiable pride in the vital role he has played in the life of his community; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas Legislature hereby honor Rosalio "Rabbit" Duran for the memorable
