RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Hilton Kelley of Port Arthur has been named a 2 recipient of the 2011 Goldman Environmental Prize, an 3 accomplishment that is truly worthy of celebration; and

WHEREAS, Created in 1990 by Richard and Rhoda Goldman, the 4 5 Goldman Environmental Prize honors individuals from around the world who are working at the local level to protect and enhance the 6 natural environment; through their grassroots efforts, these 7 community leaders have helped to empower their fellow citizens and 8 9 have inspired many to stand up for their rights; the prize is awarded annually in April to one individual from each of Africa, 10 11 Asia, Europe, North America, South and Central America, and the 12 islands and island nations; in addition to providing the recipients with international recognition for their causes, the prize includes 13 14 financial support of \$150,000 to assist them in pursuing their work, making this the world's largest award honoring grassroots 15 16 environmentalists; and

WHEREAS, Hilton Kelley was recognized with this prestigious 17 accolade for his efforts to fight pollution in his community and to 18 secure environmental justice for residents along the Texas Gulf 19 Coast; a Port Arthur native, Mr. Kelley was raised in the city's 20 21 West Side, a predominately African American neighborhood that has long stood in the shadow of the area's many oil refineries and 22 23 chemical plants; after graduating from high school he enlisted in 24 the U.S. Navy; his service took him to the San Francisco Bay area,

1 where he remained after his discharge from the navy as a petty 2 officer second class; based in Oakland, California, he found work 3 as an actor and stuntman in television and the movies and was 4 admitted to the Screen Actors Guild in 1991; he also served his 5 community as a youth activist and helped lead efforts to end gang 6 violence; and

WHEREAS, On a visit to his hometown in 2000, Mr. Kelley found 7 8 his former community in decline, facing poverty, crime, and pollution; the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has noted that 9 10 Port Arthur has some of the highest levels of toxic air releases in the country, and the companies operating the plants have been cited 11 12 with hundreds of air pollution violations; the effects of the emissions have been particularly evident 13 in the West Side 14 neighborhood, where Mr. Kelley discovered many people ill with a 15 variety of maladies and suffering from some of the highest asthma and cancer rates in the state; with few job prospects, however, and 16 17 with property values that have plummeted, most West Side residents have had no alternative but to stay; faced with these harsh facts, 18 19 Mr. Kelley was inspired to move back to Port Arthur to help its citizens rebuild; and 20

21 WHEREAS, Since returning to Port Arthur, Mr. Kelley has 22 launched a number of initiatives that have had a significant impact 23 in his community; recognizing that the city's severe environmental 24 problems would have to be addressed in order to improve economic and 25 social conditions, he established the Community In-Power and 26 Development Association (CIDA), an organization that strives to 27 empower citizens by training them to monitor emissions and air

1 quality and by educating them about pollution and their rights;
2 CIDA also advocates in behalf of the community by pushing for
3 stricter environmental regulation and by challenging the U.S.
4 Environmental Protection Agency and the Texas Commission on
5 Environmental Quality to enforce existing laws; and

WHEREAS, Among his many accomplishments, Mr. Kelley led a 6 7 campaign that resulted in the Motiva Refinery installing 8 state-of-the-art equipment to reduce emissions when it expanded its facility; he also helped negotiate an agreement with the company 9 10 that included the provision of three years of health coverage for people in the West Side neighborhood and that led to the 11 establishment of a \$3.5 million fund to spur community development 12 and provide job training; in addition, he guided the successful 13 14 effort to prevent 20,000 tons of toxic chemicals from Mexico from 15 being brought to Port Arthur for incineration; and

WHEREAS, Along with overseeing the work of CIDA, this notable 16 17 Texan serves on the EPA National Environmental Justice Advisory Council, and he speaks extensively on the environment and social 18 19 justice; he has been the recipient of numerous honors, including the 2003 Environmental Justice Award from the Lone Star Chapter of 20 the Sierra Club, a 2004 Ben and Jerry's Award for Environmental 21 Activism, a 2006 Houston Hero Award from the Citizens League for 22 23 Environmental Action Now, 2009 Houston-Galveston and а 24 Environmental Research and Outreach Award from The University of Texas Medical Branch; and 25

26 WHEREAS, With his continuing advocacy for clean air and 27 environmental justice, Hilton Kelley has made a positive difference

1 in the lives of countless Texans, and he is an inspiring example of 2 the exceptional good that one person can accomplish; now, 3 therefore, be it
