A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to certification, performance, continuing education, and
- 3 appraisal of public school teachers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subsection (b), Section 21.041, Education Code,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The board shall propose rules that:
- 8 (1) provide for the regulation of educators and the
- 9 general administration of this subchapter in a manner consistent
- 10 with this subchapter;
- 11 (2) specify the classes of educator certificates to be
- 12 issued, including probationary, provisional, standard, and
- 13 emergency certificates;
- 14 (3) specify the period for which each class of
- 15 educator certificate is valid;
- 16 (4) specify the requirements for the issuance and
- 17 renewal of an educator certificate;
- 18 (5) provide for the issuance of an educator
- 19 certificate to a person who holds a similar certificate issued by
- 20 another state or foreign country, subject to Section 21.052;
- 21 (6) provide for special or restricted certification of
- 22 educators, including certification of instructors of American Sign
- 23 Language;
- 24 (7) provide for disciplinary proceedings, including

- 1 the suspension or revocation of an educator certificate, as
- 2 provided by Chapter 2001, Government Code;
- 3 (8) provide for the adoption, amendment, and
- 4 enforcement of an educator's code of ethics; and
- 5 (9) provide for continuing education requirements[+
- 6 and
- 7 [(10) provide for certification of persons performing
- 8 appraisals under Subchapter H].
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 21.048, Education Code, is amended by
- 10 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 11 <u>(a-1)</u> In proposing rules under Subsection (a), the board
- 12 shall prescribe a comprehensive examination administered to a
- 13 person applying for certification to teach early childhood through
- 14 grade four or English as a second language in early childhood
- 15 through grade four that includes components in reading, language
- 16 arts, science, social studies, and mathematics. The reading
- 17 component must include material covering the science of reading.
- 18 The proposed rules must provide for scoring the examination based
- 19 on a cumulative score in addition to an individual score for each
- 20 component area listed in this subsection. The proposed rules must
- 21 provide a minimum scoring standard that demonstrates satisfactory
- 22 performance and content mastery for the cumulative score and each
- 23 component area. The minimum scoring standard proposed by the board
- 24 for the cumulative score must be greater than the total of the
- 25 proposed minimum scoring standard for each component area.
- 26 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 27 amended by adding Sections 21.0521, 21.0522, and 21.0523 to read as

- 1 follows:
- 2 Sec. 21.0521. PROBATIONARY CERTIFICATE. (a) The board may
- 3 issue a probationary certificate to a person enrolled in an
- 4 <u>alternative certification program or a postbaccalaureate</u>
- 5 certification program who has not completed all certification
- 6 program requirements.
- 7 (b) A probationary certificate issued under this section
- 8 expires on the first anniversary of the date on which the
- 9 certificate was issued and may be renewed only for two additional
- 10 one-year periods.
- 11 (c) A person who is issued a probationary certificate under
- 12 this section and is employed under a probationary contract for a
- 13 total of three years is eligible to receive a standard certificate
- 14 on completion of all requirements under Section 21.0523(a).
- 15 (d) A person who is issued a probationary certificate may
- 16 only be employed by a school district under a probationary contract
- 17 and is not eligible to be employed under a term contract.
- 18 Sec. 21.0522. PROVISIONAL CERTIFICATE. (a) The board
- 19 shall issue a provisional certificate to a person who has not
- 20 previously been certified as an educator in this state and who has:
- 21 (1) successfully completed an educator preparation
- 22 program;
- 23 (2) performed satisfactorily on the certification
- 24 examination required by Section 21.048; and
- 25 (3) completed all other requirements for educator
- 26 certification.
- 27 (b) A provisional certificate issued under this section:

- 1 (1) expires on the third anniversary of the date on
- 2 which the certificate was issued; and
- 3 (2) is not renewable.
- 4 (c) A person enrolled in an alternative certification
- 5 program or a postbaccalaureate certification program who has not
- 6 completed all certification program requirements is not eligible
- 7 for a provisional certificate. On completion of all requirements
- 8 of the program, including an internship of one year, the person is
- 9 eligible for a provisional certificate under this section.
- 10 (d) An educator who has been issued a probationary
- 11 certificate and is employed under a probationary contract may
- 12 receive a provisional certificate that expires on the third
- 13 anniversary of the date on which the person was originally employed
- 14 under the probationary contract.
- 15 (e) A person who is issued a provisional certificate under
- 16 this section may be employed by a school district under a term
- 17 contract as provided by Subchapter E.
- 18 Sec. 21.0523. STANDARD CERTIFICATE. (a) On the expiration
- 19 of a person's provisional certificate or at the end of a person's
- 20 third probationary contract term, the board shall issue a standard
- 21 certificate to the person if the person has:
- (1) demonstrated that the person is an effective
- 23 educator; and
- 24 (2) completed all required continuing education
- 25 hours.
- 26 (b) Notwithstanding Section 21.355, to assist the board in
- 27 determining whether a person is an effective educator, the person

- 1 applying for a standard certificate must submit to the board a copy
- 2 of all educator appraisals of the person. The board shall take
- 3 appropriate measures to maintain the confidentiality of the
- 4 appraisals.
- 5 (c) The commissioner shall adopt rules to establish
- 6 criteria for determining whether a person is an effective educator
- 7 for purposes of this section.
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 21.054, Education Code, is amended by
- 9 adding Subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 10 (b) The board shall implement an evaluation and
- 11 accountability system for continuing education courses offered in
- 12 this state and monitor the quality of all continuing education
- 13 courses.
- 14 SECTION 5. Section 21.351, Education Code, is amended by
- 15 adding Subsections (a-1), (e), and (f) to read as follows:
- 16 <u>(a-1)</u> The recommended appraisal process must provide that
- 17 not less than 30 percent or more than 50 percent of the appraisal is
- 18 based on a measurement of the teacher's effectiveness including the
- 19 annual improvement of the teacher's students' achievement. The
- 20 commissioner by rule shall define teacher effectiveness and the
- 21 multiple measures for determining teacher effectiveness. The
- 22 performance of a teacher's students on assessment instruments
- 23 required under Subchapter B, Chapter 39, may not be the primary
- 24 indicator for determining teacher effectiveness. The recommended
- 25 appraisal process must provide a method for determining the
- 26 <u>effectiveness of teachers who do not teach a subject in which</u>
- 27 assessment instruments under Subchapter B, Chapter 39, are

- 1 administered.
- 2 (e) A teacher must be observed for a period of at least 45
- 3 minutes at least twice during each school year. An observation of a
- 4 teacher may occur on multiple occasions for a total period of 45
- 5 minutes.
- 6 (f) Not later than September 1, 2016, the commissioner shall
- 7 adopt rules that redesign the recommended appraisal process. The
- 8 commissioner shall consult with educators, administrative leaders,
- 9 education experts, and parents of students in developing the
- 10 recommended appraisal process and may contract with public or
- 11 private entities as necessary to implement this subsection. Before
- 12 the commissioner adopts rules required by this subsection, the
- 13 commissioner must develop, validate, and test the proposals
- 14 regarding the redesign of the recommended appraisal process. The
- 15 commissioner may initiate pilot projects to implement and test
- 16 redesign proposals, which may address different aspects of the
- 17 redesign and different methods for determining teacher
- 18 effectiveness. The rules adopted by the commissioner must include
- 19 the measurement of the teacher's effectiveness and the annual
- 20 improvement in the achievement of the teacher's students under
- 21 Subsection (a-1). In determining the measurement of the teacher's
- 22 effectiveness including the annual improvement in the achievement
- 23 of the teacher's students, the rules must provide that the process
- 24 is fair, transparent, timely, rigorous, and valid. This subsection
- 25 expires September 1, 2016.
- SECTION 6. Section 21.352, Education Code, is amended by
- 27 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (b-1) to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 (a) In appraising teachers, each school district shall use:
- 3 (1) the appraisal process and performance criteria
- 4 developed by the commissioner; or
- 5 (2) an appraisal process and performance criteria:
- 6 (A) developed by the district- and campus-level
- 7 committees established under Section 11.251 <u>in collaboration with</u>
- 8 education experts and educators, administrative leaders, and
- 9 parents of students in the district;
- 10 (B) containing the items described by Sections
- 11 21.351(a)(1) and (2); [and]
- 12 (C) adopted by the board of trustees; and
- 13 (D) approved by the commissioner.
- 14 (b-1) The commissioner may adopt rules regarding approval
- 15 of local appraisal processes under Subsection (a).
- 16 (c) An evaluation [Except as otherwise provided by this
- 17 subsection, appraisal] must be done at least twice [once] during
- 18 each school year. A teacher must be observed for a period of at
- 19 <u>least 45 minutes as provided by Section 21.351(e)</u> [may be appraised
- 20 less frequently if the teacher agrees in writing and the teacher's
- 21 most recent evaluation rated the teacher as at least proficient, or
- 22 the equivalent, and did not identify any area of deficiency. A
- 23 teacher who is appraised less frequently than annually must be
- 24 appraised at least once during each period of five school years].
- 25 The district shall maintain a written copy of the evaluation of each
- 26 teacher's performance in the teacher's personnel file. Each
- 27 teacher is entitled to receive a written copy of the evaluation on

- 1 its completion. After receiving a written copy of the evaluation, a
- 2 teacher is entitled to a second appraisal by a different appraiser
- 3 or to submit a written rebuttal to the evaluation to be attached to
- 4 the evaluation in the teacher's personnel file. The evaluation and
- 5 any rebuttal may be given to another school district at which the
- 6 teacher has applied for employment at the request of that district.
- 7 SECTION 7. Subchapter H, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 21.3521 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 21.3521. INDIVIDUALIZED PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT
- 10 PLAN. (a) On the conclusion of a teacher's observation, the
- 11 teacher and the principal of the school at which the teacher is
- 12 employed shall prepare an individualized professional development
- 13 plan for the teacher. The plan must include continuing education
- 14 requirements for the teacher and must be linked to:
- 15 (1) any areas identified in the teacher's appraisal as
- 16 <u>needing improvement;</u>
- 17 (2) any areas identified by the teacher as appropriate
- 18 for achievement of specific professional goals; and
- 19 (3) the subject area taught by the teacher.
- 20 (b) The principal must provide sufficient opportunities for
- 21 the teacher to achieve the requirements and goals included in the
- 22 <u>teacher's individualized professional development plan prepared</u>
- 23 under Subsection (a).
- SECTION 8. Section 21.355, Education Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- Sec. 21.355. CONFIDENTIALITY. Except as provided by
- 27 Section 21.0523, a [A] document evaluating the performance of a

- 1 teacher or administrator is confidential.
- 2 SECTION 9. Subchapter H, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Section 21.358 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 21.358. QUALIFICATIONS OF APPRAISERS. The
- 5 commissioner shall adopt rules regarding the minimum
- 6 qualifications necessary for a person who conducts teacher
- 7 appraisals. The rules must require that the appraiser be highly
- 8 qualified to assess instructional quality and demonstrate
- 9 <u>instructional leadership.</u>
- 10 SECTION 10. Subchapter J, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Section 21.4581 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 21.4581. LEADERSHIP PROGRAM. The commissioner shall
- 13 create specialized mid-management certificates in teacher
- 14 <u>leadership</u> for qualified teachers who have demonstrated
- 15 <u>effectiveness</u> as a teacher under criteria determined by
- 16 <u>commissioner rule.</u>
- 17 SECTION 11. (a) Sections 21.0521, 21.0522, and 21.0523,
- 18 Education Code, as added by this Act, apply to a person who has
- 19 never been certified to teach in this state who applies for
- 20 certification on or after September 1, 2013. A person who has never
- 21 been certified to teach in this state who applies for certification
- 22 before September 1, 2013, or a person who is certified to teach in
- 23 this state on September 1, 2013, is governed by the law in effect
- 24 immediately before September 1, 2013, and that law is continued in
- 25 effect for that purpose.
- 26 (b) Not later than January 1, 2012, the State Board for
- 27 Educator Certification shall propose rules as required by this Act.

- 1 SECTION 12. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of
- 2 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
- 3 (b) Sections 21.0521, 21.0522, 21.0523, and 21.4581,
- 4 Education Code, as added by this Act, take effect September 1, 2013.
