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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the inclusion and exclusion of certain information as part of the immunization registry. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Sections 161.007(a), (b), (b-1), (c), (d), (e), and (f), Health and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) The department, for the primary purpose of establishing and maintaining a single repository of accurate, complete, and 8 current immunization records to be used in aiding, coordinating, 9 and promoting efficient and cost-effective communicable disease 10 prevention and control efforts, shall establish and maintain an 11 immunization registry. The executive commissioner of the Health 12 and Human Services Commission by rule shall develop guidelines to: 13 14 (1) protect the confidentiality of patients in accordance with Section 159.002, Occupations Code; 15 inform the individual or the individual's legally 16 (2)17 authorized representative about the registry and that registry information may be released under Section 161.00735; 18 for an individual younger than 18 years of age, 19 (3) permit [require the written or electronic consent of the individual 20 21 or] the individual's legally authorized representative to have the individual excluded from [before any information relating to the 22 individual is included in] the registry; and 23 24 (4) for an individual 18 years of age or older:

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S.B. No. 56 (A) require the consent of the individual or the 1 individual's legally authorized representative for continued 2 3 inclusion in the registry; 4 (B) permit the individual or the individual's 5 legally authorized representative to withdraw consent for the individual to be included in the registry; and 6 7 (C) [(5)] determine the process by which consent 8 is verified before the inclusion of any individually identifiable information in the registry[, including affirmation by a health 9 care provider, birth registrar, regional health information 10 exchange, or local immunization registry that consent has been 11 obtained]. 12 Except Section 13 (b) as provided by 161.0071, the 14 immunization registry must contain information on the immunization 15 history that is obtained by the department under: 16 (1) this section of each individual: 17 (A) younger than 18 years of age for whom exclusion from the registry has not been requested; and 18 19 (B) 18 years of age or older for whom consent to remain in the registry has been obtained in accordance with 20 21 guidelines adopted under Subsection [(a) or] (a-3)[, as applicable]; 22 Section 161.00705 of persons immunized to prepare 23 (2) 24 for or in response to a declared disaster, public health emergency, terrorist attack, hostile military or paramilitary action, or 25 26 extraordinary law enforcement emergency; (3) Section 161.00706 of first responders or their 27

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1 immediate family members; and

2 (4) Section 161.00735 of persons evacuated or
3 relocated to this state because of a disaster.

4 (b-1) [The department shall remove from the registry 5 information for any individual for whom consent has been 6 withdrawn.] The department may not retain <u>and must remove from the</u> 7 <u>registry</u> individually identifiable information about any 8 individual:

9 (1) <u>younger than 18 years of age</u> for whom <u>a request to</u> 10 <u>be excluded from the registry has been received under this section;</u>

11 (2) 18 years of age or older for whom consent to remain 12 in the registry has not been received, has been withdrawn, or cannot 13 be verified;

14 <u>(3)</u> [(2)] for whom a consent for continued inclusion 15 in the registry following the end of the declared disaster, public 16 health emergency, terrorist attack, hostile military or 17 paramilitary action, or extraordinary law enforcement emergency 18 has not been received under Section 161.00705(f);

19 <u>(4)</u> [(3)] for whom a request to be removed from the 20 registry has been received under Section 161.00706(e);

21 (5) [(4)] for whom consent for continued inclusion in 22 the registry following the end of a disaster has not been received 23 under Section 161.00735(f); or

24 (6) [(5)] for whom a request to remove information
 25 from the registry has been received under Section 161.00735(g).

26 (c) A payor that receives data elements from a health care27 provider who administers an immunization to an individual younger

than 18 years of age shall provide the data elements to the 1 department. A payor is required to provide the department with 2 3 only the data elements the payor receives from a health care provider. A payor that receives data elements from a health care 4 5 provider who administers an immunization to an individual 18 years or older may provide the data elements to 6 of age the department. The data elements shall be submitted in a format 7 8 prescribed by the department. The department shall verify consent to remain in the registry for an individual 18 years of age or older 9 before including the reported information in the immunization 10 registry. [The department may not retain individually 11 identifiable information about an individual for whom consent 12 cannot be verified.] 13

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14 (d) A health care provider who administers an immunization to an individual younger than 18 years of age shall provide data 15 elements regarding an immunization to the department. A health 16 17 care provider who administers an immunization to an individual 18 years of age or older may submit data elements regarding an 18 immunization to the department. The data elements shall 19 be 20 submitted in a format prescribed by the department. [The department shall verify consent before including the information in 21 the immunization registry. The department may not retain 22 individually identifiable information about an individual for whom 23 24 consent cannot be verified.]

(e) The department shall provide notice to a health care
provider that submits an immunization history for an individual <u>18</u>
<u>years of age or older</u> for whom consent cannot be verified. The

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1 notice shall contain instructions for <u>the individual to</u> [obtaining]
2 consent in accordance with guidelines adopted under Subsections (a)
3 and (a-3) and <u>for the health care provider to resubmit</u>
4 [resubmitting] the immunization history to the department.

5 The department and health care providers may use the (f) registry to provide notices by mail, telephone, personal contact, 6 or other means to an individual or the individual's legally 7 8 authorized representative regarding an individual who is due or overdue for a particular type of immunization according to the 9 department's immunization schedule for children or 10 another analogous schedule recognized by the department for individuals 18 11 12 years of age or older. The notice must contain instructions for the legally authorized representative of an individual younger than 18 13 14 years of age to request that future notices not be sent and to 15 remove the individual's immunization record from the registry and any registry-related records. The notice must describe the 16 17 procedure to report a violation if the individual's immunization record is included in the registry after requesting exclusion. 18 The 19 department shall consult with health care providers to determine the most efficient and cost-effective manner of using the registry 20 to provide those notices. 21

SECTION 2. Sections 161.0071(a) and (b), Health and Safety
Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) The first time the department receives registry data for
an individual who is younger than 18 years of age or for whom the
department has received consent to <u>remain</u> [be included] in the
registry, the department shall send notice to the individual or the

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1 individual's legally authorized representative disclosing: 2 (1)that providers and payors may be sending the 3 individual's immunization information to the department, but the department may not keep the information if the individual's legally 4 authorized representative chooses to exclude the individual from 5 the registry or, for an individual 18 years of age or older, the 6 individual or the individual's legally authorized representative 7 8 withdraws consent to remain in the registry; 9 (2) the information that is included in the registry; the persons to whom the information may be 10 (3) released under Sections 161.00735(b) and 161.008(d); 11 (4) the purpose and use of the registry; 12 the procedure to exclude an individual from the 13 (5) 14 registry; and 15 (6) the procedure to report a violation if an 16 individual's information is included in the registry after 17 exclusion has been requested [or consent has been withdrawn]. On receipt of a written or electronic request to exclude 18 (b) an individual's immunization records from or on discovering that 19 consent for an individual 18 years of age or older to remain [be 20 21 included] in the registry has not been granted or has been withdrawn, the department shall exclude the individual's 22 23 immunization records from the registry and any other 24 registry-related department record that individually identifies 25 the individual. SECTION 3. Section 161.008(c), Health and Safety Code, is 26 amended to read as follows: 27

(c) The department may obtain the data constituting an 1 immunization record for an individual from a public health 2 district, a local health department, the individual or the 3 individual's legally authorized representative, a physician to the 4 5 individual, a payor, or any health care provider licensed or otherwise authorized to administer vaccines. The department shall 6 verify consent to remain in the registry for an individual 18 years 7 8 of age or older before including the reported information in the immunization registry. [The department may not 9 -retain 10 individually identifiable information about an individual for whom consent cannot be verified.] 11

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SECTION 4. Section 161.0107(c), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

14 (c) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human15 Services Commission by rule shall specify:

16 (1) the fields necessary to populate the immunization 17 registry, including a field that indicates the patient's consent to 18 <u>remain</u> [be listed] in the immunization registry <u>for an individual</u> 19 <u>18 years of age or older</u> [has been obtained]; and

20 (2) the data standards that must be used for21 electronic submission of immunization information.

SECTION 5. Section 161.007(a-1), Health and Safety Code, is repealed.

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SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
