A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the adoption of an alternative base period for
- 3 computation of unemployment compensation benefits.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 201.011(1), Labor Code, is repealed.
- 6 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 201, Labor Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 201.013 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 201.013. DEFINITION OF BASE PERIOD; ALTERNATE BASE
- 9 PERIODS. (a) For purposes of this subtitle and subject to this
- 10 section, an individual's base period is the four consecutive
- 11 completed calendar quarters, prescribed by the commission, in the
- 12 five consecutive completed calendar quarters preceding the first
- 13 day of an individual's benefit year.
- 14 (b) For an individual precluded because of a medically
- 15 verifiable injury or illness from working during a major part of a
- 16 calendar quarter of the period that would otherwise be the
- 17 individual's base period under Subsection (a), the base period is
- 18 the first four calendar quarters of the five consecutive calendar
- 19 quarters preceding the calendar quarter in which the illness began
- 20 or the injury occurred if the individual files an initial claim for
- 21 benefits not later than 24 months after the date on which the
- 22 individual's injury or illness began or occurred.
- (c) For an individual who does not have sufficient benefit
- 24 wage credits to qualify for benefits under the computation of the

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- 1 base period as provided by Subsection (a) or (b), the base period is
- 2 the four most recently completed calendar quarters preceding the
- 3 first day of the individual's benefit year.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act applies only to eligibility for
- 5 unemployment compensation benefits based on a claim that is filed
- 6 with the Texas Workforce Commission on or after the effective date
- 7 of this Act. A claim filed before the effective date of this Act is
- 8 governed by the law in effect on the date the claim was filed, and
- 9 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
