## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to prohibitions on the use of a wireless communication

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 545.425(a)(1), (b), (d), and (e),
- 6 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (1) "Hands-free device" means speakerphone capability
- 8 or a telephone attachment or other piece of equipment, regardless
- 9 of whether permanently installed in the motor vehicle, that allows
- 10 use of the wireless communication device without use of either of
- 11 the operator's hands, except to activate or deactivate the
- 12 hands-free device.
- 13 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), an operator may
- 14 not use a wireless communication device while operating a motor
- 15 vehicle [within a school crossing zone, as defined by Section
- 16 541.302, Transportation Code, unless:
- 17 (1) the vehicle is stopped; or
- 18 (2) the wireless communication device is used with a
- 19 hands-free device.
- 20 (d) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution of an
- 21 offense under this section that [+
- $[\frac{1}{2}]$  the wireless communication device was used to
- 23 make an emergency call to:
- (1)  $\left[\frac{(A)}{A}\right]$  an emergency response service, including a

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- 1 rescue, emergency medical, or hazardous material response service;
- 3  $\underline{(3)}$  [(C)] a fire department;
- 4 (4) [<del>(D)</del>] a health clinic;
- 5 (5) [<del>(E)</del>] a medical doctor's office;
- $\underline{\text{(6)}}$  [ $\overline{\text{(F)}}$ ] an individual to administer first aid
- 7 treatment; or
- 8 (7) [(G)] a law enforcement agency [police
- 9 department; or
- 10 [(2) a sign required by Subsection (b-1) was not
- 11 posted at the entrance to the school crossing zone at the time of an
- 12 offense committed in the school crossing zone].
- 13 (e) It is an exception to the application of Subsections (b)
- 14 and (c) that the operator is [This section does not apply to]:
- 15 (1) an operator of an authorized emergency vehicle
- 16 using a wireless communication device while acting in an official
- 17 capacity; or
- 18 (2) a person [an operator who is] licensed by the
- 19 Federal Communications Commission to operate [while operating] a
- 20 radio frequency device or [other than] a wireless communication
- 21 device.
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 545.425(b-1), Transportation Code, is
- 23 repealed.
- SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 25 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 26 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 27 governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and

- 1 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 2 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 3 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was
- 4 committed before that date.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect January 1, 2012.
