8	to obtain a controlled substance or combination of controlled

10	amount of a controlled substance or substances that is not
11	medically necessary for the person, obtains or attempts to obtain
12	from a practitioner a controlled substance or a prescription for a
13	controlled substance by misrepresentation, fraud, forgery,
14	deception, subterfuge, or concealment of a material fact. For
15	purposes of this subsection, a material fact includes whether the
16	person has an existing prescription for a controlled substance
17	issued for the same period of time by another practitioner.
18	(d-1) An offense under Subsection (a-1) is:
19	(1) a felony of the second degree if any controlled
20	substance that is the subject of the offense is listed in Schedule I
21	or II;
22	(2) a felony of the third degree if any controlled
23	substance that is the subject of the offense is listed in Schedule

III or IV; and

- 1 (3) a Class A misdemeanor if any controlled substance
- 2 that is the subject of the offense is listed in Schedule V.
- 3 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 4 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 5 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 6 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the
- 7 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of
- 8 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of
- 9 this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
