BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Article 45.056, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 5 amended by amending Subsections (c), (d), and (e) and adding 6 Subsections (f), (g), and (h) to read as follows:

7 (c) A county or justice court on approval of the 8 commissioners court or a <u>municipality or</u> municipal court on 9 approval of the city council may employ one or more [full-time] 10 juvenile case managers to assist the court in administering the 11 court's juvenile docket and in supervising its court orders in 12 juvenile cases.

13 (d) Pursuant to Article 102.0174, the court may pay the 14 salary and benefits of <u>a</u> [the] juvenile case manager from the 15 juvenile case manager fund.

(e) A juvenile case manager employed under Subsection (c)
17 shall <u>give priority to</u> [work primarily on] cases brought under
18 Sections 25.093 and 25.094, Education Code.

19 (f) The juvenile case manager shall timely report to the 20 judge who signed the order or judgment and, on request, to the judge 21 assigned to the case or the presiding judge any information or 22 recommendations relevant to assisting the judge in making decisions 23 that are in the best interest of the child.

24 (g) The judge who is assigned to the case shall consult with

1	the juvenile case manager who is supervising the case regarding:
2	(1) the child's home environment;
3	(2) the child's developmental, psychological, and
4	educational status;
5	(3) the child's previous interaction with the justice
6	system; and
7	(4) any sanctions available to the court that would be
8	in the best interest of the child.
9	(h) Subsections (f) and (g) do not apply to:
10	(1) a part-time judge; or
11	(2) a county judge of a county court that has one or
12	more appointed full-time magistrates under Section 54.1172,
13	Government Code.
14	SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Article
15	45.056, Code of Criminal Procedure, apply to a juvenile case
16	manager employed on or after the effective date of this Act,
17	regardless of whether the juvenile case manager began that
18	employment before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.
19	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
