- 9 I am your Texas flag!
- 10 I was born January 25, 1839.
- I am one of only two flags of an American state that has also
- served as the symbol of an independent nation--The Republic
- of Texas.
- While you may honor me in retirement, the spirit I represent
- will never retire!
- I represent the spirit of Texas--Yesterday, Today, and
- 17 Tomorrow!
- I represent the bravery of the Alamo and the Victory at San
- 19 Jacinto.
- 20 My spirit rode with the Texas Rangers over the Forts Trail of
- the Big Country and herded cattle through the Fort Worth
- 22 stockyards. I have sailed up Galveston Bay and kept a
- 23 watchful eye over our El Paso del Norte.
- 24 My colors are in the waters of the Red River and in the

- 1 Bluebonnets of the Texas Hill Country.
- 2 You'll find my spirit at the Light House of Palo Duro and in
