- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 28.0021, Education Code,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The Texas essential knowledge and skills and, as
- 8 applicable, Section 28.025 shall require instruction in personal
- 9 financial literacy in:
- 10 (1) mathematics instruction in kindergarten through
- 11 grade eight; and
- 12 (2) one or more courses required for high school
- 13 graduation.
- SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 31.0231, Education Code,
- 15 is amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) The commissioner shall adopt a list of:
- 17 (1) electronic textbooks; and
- 18 (2) instructional material that conveys information
- 19 to the student or otherwise contributes to the learning process,
- 20 including tools, models, and investigative materials designed for
- 21 use as part of the foundation curriculum for:
- 22 <u>(A)</u> science in kindergarten through grade five;
- 23 and
- 24 (B) personal financial literacy in kindergarten

1 through grade eight.

- 2 SECTION 3. For purposes of the textbook review and adoption
- 3 requirements under Section 31.022, Education Code, the State Board
- 4 of Education shall review and adopt mathematics textbooks that
- 5 satisfy the requirements of Section 28.0021, Education Code, as
- 6 amended by this Act, on the next scheduled review and adoption cycle
- 7 for mathematics textbooks after the effective date of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2011-2012
- 9 school year.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
