A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the automatic enrollment of certain women in the
3	demonstration project for women's health care services.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 32.0248, Human Resources Code, is
6	amended by amending Subsections (a), (g), and (i) and adding
7	Subsections (b-1) and (b-2) to read as follows:
8	(a) The department shall operate [establish] a [five-year]
9	demonstration project through the medical assistance program to
10	expand access to preventive health and family planning services for
11	women. A woman eligible [under Subsection (b)] to participate in
12	the demonstration project may receive appropriate preventive
13	health and family planning services, including:
14	(1) medical history recording and evaluation;
15	(2) physical examinations;
16	(3) health screenings, including screening for:
17	(A) diabetes;
18	(B) cervical cancer;
19	(C) breast cancer;
20	(D) sexually transmitted diseases;
21	(E) hypertension;
22	(F) cholesterol; and
23	(G) tuberculosis;
24	(4) counseling and education on contraceptive methods

- 1 emphasizing the health benefits of abstinence from sexual activity
- 2 to recipients who are not married, except for counseling and
- 3 education regarding emergency contraception;
- 4 (5) provision of contraceptives, except for the
- 5 provision of emergency contraception;
- 6 (6) risk assessment; and
- 7 (7) referral of medical problems to appropriate
- 8 providers that are entities or organizations that do not perform or
- 9 promote elective abortions or contract or affiliate with entities
- 10 that perform or promote elective abortions.
- 11 (b-1) On the 61st day after the date a woman who received
- 12 benefits through the medical assistance program during her
- 13 pregnancy gives birth, the department shall automatically enroll
- 14 the woman in the demonstration project for a period of 10 months if
- 15 she is otherwise eligible to participate in the project.
- 16 (b-2) The department shall modify any applicable
- 17 administrative procedures to ensure that a woman described by
- 18 Subsection (b-1) maintains continuous eligibility for any services
- 19 provided by both the medical assistance program and the
- 20 demonstration project during the transition from participation in
- 21 the medical assistance program to participation in the
- 22 <u>demonstration project.</u>
- 23 (g) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 24 the department shall submit a report to the legislature regarding
- 25 the department's operation of [progress in establishing and
- 26 operating | the demonstration project.
- 27 (i) This section expires September 1, 2021 [$\frac{2011}{2}$].

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- 1 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 2 to a person who receives medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human
- 3 Resources Code, on or after the effective date of this Act,
- 4 regardless of the date on which eligibility for the medical
- 5 assistance was determined.
- 6 SECTION 3. If before implementing Section 32.0248, Human
- 7 Resources Code, as amended by this Act, a state agency determines
- 8 that an amendment to the existing waiver or other authorization is
- 9 necessary to extend the operation of the demonstration project for
- 10 women's health care services under that section as amended, the
- 11 agency affected by the provision shall request the amendment to the
- 12 waiver or other authorization and may delay implementing that
- 13 section until the amendment or other authorization is granted.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect August 31, 2011.
