A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the powers and duties of certain emergency services
- 3 districts.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 775.0205(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) If the territory in a district created under this
- 8 chapter overlaps with the boundaries of another district created
- 9 under this chapter [or a district created under Chapter 776], the
- 10 most recently created district may not provide services in the
- 11 overlapping territory that duplicate the services provided by the
- 12 other district at the time the overlapping district was created.
- SECTION 2. Section 775.056(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) After a hearing, a district may make mutually agreeable
- 16 changes in boundaries with another district, [or a district created
- 17 under Chapter 776, provided that the maximum tax rate authorized
- 18 for such a district does not exceed the maximum tax rate previously
- 19 authorized for any territory added to that district. The districts
- 20 shall agree on an effective date for the changes in boundaries.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 344.051(c), Local Government Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- (c) Except as provided by Subsection (f), a district may be
- 24 created inside the boundaries of an emergency services district

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- 1 operating under Chapter 775 [or 776], Health and Safety Code, only
- 2 if the governing body of the emergency services district gives its
- 3 written consent by order or resolution not later than the 60th day
- 4 after the date the governing body receives a request for its
- 5 consent.
- 6 SECTION 4. Section 323.101(f), Tax Code, is amended to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (f) The provisions of this chapter govern the application,
- 9 collection, and administration of a sales and use tax imposed under
- 10 Chapter 285 or $[\tau]$ 775, $[\sigma r 776\tau]$ Health and Safety Code, to the
- 11 extent not inconsistent with the provisions of those chapters.
- 12 Provided, however, that Subsection (b) shall not apply to a tax
- 13 authorized under those chapters.
- 14 SECTION 5. Chapter 776, Health and Safety Code, is
- 15 repealed.
- SECTION 6. (a) On the effective date of this Act, a district
- 17 created under Chapter 776, Health and Safety Code, is converted
- 18 into a district operated under Chapter 775, Health and Safety Code.
- 19 A district converted under this section continues in existence and
- 20 is subject to Chapter 775, Health and Safety Code.
- 21 (b) On and after the effective date of this Act, each person
- 22 serving as an emergency commissioner of a district created under
- 23 Chapter 776, Health and Safety Code, is an emergency services
- 24 commissioner and shall serve on the board of the district as an
- 25 emergency services commissioner for the remainder of the unexpired
- 26 term to which the person was elected.
- 27 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
