- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1102.114, Occupations Code, is amended
- to read as follows:
- Sec. 1102.114. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE. The commission shall 7
- issue the appropriate license to an applicant who: 8
- 9 (1) meets the required qualifications; and
- pays the fee required by Section 1102.352(a)[; and 10
- 11 (3) offers proof that the applicant carries liability
- 12 insurance with a minimum limit of \$100,000 per occurrence to
- protect the public against a violation of Subchapter G]. 13
- SECTION 2. Section 1102.203(a), Occupations 14 Code, is
- amended to read as follows: 15
- A person may renew an unexpired license by paying the 16
- required renewal fee to the commission before the expiration date 17
- of the license [and providing proof of liability insurance as 18
- required by Section 1102.114(3)]. 19
- SECTION 3. (a) The change in law made by this Act to Section 20
- 21 1102.114, Occupations Code, applies only to an application for a
- real estate inspector license submitted to the Texas Real Estate 22
- Commission on or after the effective date of this Act. 23
- application for a license submitted before that date is governed by 24

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- 1 the law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and the
- 2 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 3 (b) The change in law made by this Act to Section 1102.203,
- 4 Occupations Code, applies only to the renewal of a license that
- 5 expires on or after the effective date of this Act. A license that
- 6 expires before that date is governed by the law in effect on the
- 7 date the license expires, and the former law is continued in effect
- 8 for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
