4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 242, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 242.0947 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 242.0947. IMMUNITY FROM CIVIL LIABILITY; PAYMENT OF
8	CERTAIN LEGAL FEES INCURRED BY TRUSTEE. (a) This section applies
9	only to a trustee appointed under Section 242.094 to operate:
10	(1) a nursing or convalescent home; or
11	(2) an assisted living facility as authorized under
12	Section 247.003(b).
13	(b) A trustee is not liable for civil damages for an act or

- (c) The trustee is entitled to payment for reasonable legal 16
- fees actually incurred by the trustee in fulfilling the trustee's 17
- duties. 18
- (d) Notwithstanding Section 242.096(b), a trustee of a home 19
- may use the emergency assistance funds available under Section 20
- 242.096 to pay reasonable legal fees actually incurred by the 21
- 22 trustee in fulfilling the trustee's duties. Notwithstanding
- Section 242.096(c), a court may order the department to disburse 23
- emergency assistance funds to the trustee to pay reasonable legal 24

- 1 fees actually incurred by the trustee in fulfilling the trustee's

- 3 (e) Notwithstanding Section 242.0965(b), a trustee of an
- 4 assisted living facility may use the emergency assistance funds

- 7 duties. Notwithstanding Section 242.0965(c), a court may order the
- 8 <u>department to disburse emergency assistance funds to the trustee to</u>
- 9 pay reasonable legal fees actually incurred by the trustee in
- 10 fulfilling the trustee's duties.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 252, Health and Safety
- 12 Code, is amended by adding Section 252.0935 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 252.0935. IMMUNITY FROM CIVIL LIABILITY; PAYMENT OF
- 14 CERTAIN LEGAL FEES INCURRED BY TRUSTEE. (a) This section applies
- 15 only to a trustee appointed under Section 252.093 to operate a
- 16 facility.
- 17 (b) A trustee is not liable for civil damages for an act or
- 18 omission committed in good faith in the official scope of the
- 19 trustee's duties.
- 20 (c) The trustee is entitled to payment for reasonable legal
- 21 fees actually incurred by the trustee in fulfilling the trustee's
- 22 <u>duties.</u>
- 23 (d) Notwithstanding Section 252.095(c), a trustee may use
- 24 the emergency assistance funds available under Section 252.095 to
- 25 pay reasonable legal fees actually incurred by the trustee in
- 26 <u>fulfilling the trustee's duties.</u> Notwithstanding Section
- 27 252.095(d), a court may order the department to disburse emergency

- 1 assistance funds to the trustee to pay reasonable legal fees
- 2 actually incurred by the trustee in fulfilling the trustee's
- 3 duties.
- 4 SECTION 3. (a) Subsection (b), Section 242.0947, and
- 5 Subsection (b), Section 252.0935, Health and Safety Code, as added
- 6 by this Act, apply only to an act or omission by a trustee that
- 7 occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. An act or
- 8 omission that occurred before the effective date of this Act is
- 9 governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
- 10 of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 11 purpose.
- 12 (b) Subsections (c), (d), and (e), Section 242.0947, and
- 13 Subsections (c) and (d), Section 252.0935, Health and Safety Code,
- 14 as added by this Act, apply only to legal fees incurred by a trustee
- 15 on or after the effective date of this Act. Legal fees incurred by a
- 16 trustee before the effective date of this Act are governed by the
- 17 law in effect when the fees were incurred, and the former law is
- 18 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
