A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the idling of motor vehicles.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 382, Health and Safety
5	Code, is amended by adding Section 382.0191 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 382.0191. IDLING OF MOTOR VEHICLE. (a) In this
7	section, "idling" means allowing an engine to run while the motor
8	vehicle is not engaged in forward or reverse motion.
9	(b) The commission may not prohibit or limit the idling of
10	any motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating greater than
11	8,500 pounds that is equipped with a 2008 or subsequent model year
12	heavy-duty diesel engine or liquefied or compressed natural gas
13	engine that has been certified by the United States Environmental
14	Protection Agency or another state environmental agency to emit no
15	more than 30 grams of nitrogen oxides emissions per hour when
16	idling.
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- 17 SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 622, Transportation Code,
- 18 is amended by adding Section 622.955 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 622.955. INCREASE OF MAXIMUM WEIGHT FOR VEHICLES WITH
- 20 IDLE REDUCTION SYSTEMS. (a) For purposes of this section, "idle
- 21 reduction system" means a system that provides heating, cooling, or
- 22 <u>electrical service to a commercial vehicle's sleeper berth for the</u>
- 23 purpose of reducing the idling of a motor vehicle.
- 24 (b) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, the

- 1 maximum gross vehicle weight limit and axle weight limit for any
- 2 vehicle or combination of vehicles equipped with an idle reduction
- 3 system shall be increased by an amount necessary to compensate for
- 4 the additional weight of the idle reduction system.
- 5 (c) The weight increase under Subsection (b) may not be
- 6 greater than 400 pounds.
- 7 (d) On request by an appropriate law enforcement officer or
- 8 an official of an appropriate regulatory agency, the vehicle
- 9 operator shall provide proof that:
- 10 (1) the idle reduction technology is fully functional
- 11 at all times; and
- 12 (2) the weight increase is not used for any purpose
- 13 other than the use of an idle reduction system.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
