A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the identification of breeder deer by microchips.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subdivision (5), Section 43.351, Parks and
5	Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows:
6	(5) "Durable identification tag" means a single tag
7	that is not easily dislodged or removed, is [and] made of a material
8	that is not likely to disintegrate or decompose, and bears an
9	alphanumeric identifier approved by the department that is unique
10	to the breeder deer to which it is attached or implanted. The term
11	includes a department-approved external tag, microchip implant, or
12	other identification device that meets the requirements of this
13	definition. [The term includes, but is not limited to, newly
14	developed technologies, including radio frequency identification
15	tags.]
16	SECTION 2. Section 43.3561, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Sec. 43.3561. IDENTIFICATION OF BREEDER DEER. (a) Not
19	later than March 31 of the year following the year in which \underline{a} [the]
20	breeder deer is born, $\underline{\text{the}}$ [$\underline{\textbf{a}}$] breeder deer held in a permitted deer
21	breeding facility must be identified by $\underline{\cdot}$
22	(1) affixing to the deer an external durable
23	identification tag that is reasonably visible;
24	(2) implanting a durable identification tag that is a

- 2 (3) affixing or implanting, as appropriate, any other
- 3 department-approved durable identification tag [placing on each
- 4 breeder deer possessed by the deer breeder a single, reasonably
- 5 visible, durable identification tag bearing an alphanumeric number
- 6 of not more than four characters assigned by the department to the
- 7 breeding facility in which the breeder deer was born and unique to
- 8 that breeder deer].
- 9 <u>(b)</u> A deer breeder is not required to remove the <u>durable</u>
- 10 <u>identification</u> tag for any purpose but may remove the tag and
- 11 replace the tag immediately to meet the requirements of this
- 12 section.
- 13 (c) Except as provided by Subsection (e), a $[\frac{b}{A}]$ person
- 14 may not remove or knowingly permit the removal of a breeder deer
- 15 held in a facility by a permittee under this subchapter unless the
- 16 breeder deer has been permanently and legibly tattooed in one ear
- 17 with the unique <u>alphanumeric identifier approved by the department</u>
- 18 [identification number assigned to the breeder in lawful possession
- 19 of the breeder deer and specific to the breeding facility in which
- 20 the breeder deer was born or initially introduced if from an
- 21 out-of-state source].
- 22 (d) Except as provided by Subsection (e), a [(c) A] person
- 23 may not knowingly accept or permit the acceptance of a breeder deer
- 24 into a facility regulated under this subchapter unless the breeder
- 25 deer has been permanently and legibly tattooed in one ear with the
- 26 unique alphanumeric identifier approved by the department
- 27 [identification number assigned to the breeder in lawful possession

- 1 of the breeder deer and specific to the facility in which the
- 2 breeder deer was born or initially introduced if from an
- 3 out-of-state source].
- 4 (e) Instead of using a tattoo to identify a breeder deer
- 5 under Subsection (c) or (d), a deer breeder may identify a deer by
- 6 using a department-approved microchip implanted under the deer's
- 7 skin or other department-approved identification device.
- 8 SECTION 3. Subsection (b), Section 43.357, Parks and
- 9 Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 10 (b) The commission may make regulations governing:
- 11 (1) the possession of breeder deer held under the
- 12 authority of this subchapter;
- 13 (2) the recapture of lawfully possessed breeder deer
- 14 that have escaped from the facility of a deer breeder;
- 15 (3) permit applications and fees;
- 16 (4) reporting requirements;
- 17 (5) procedures and requirements for the purchase,
- 18 transfer, sale, or shipment of breeder deer;
- 19 (6) the endorsement of a deer breeder facility by a
- 20 certified wildlife biologist;
- 21 (7) the number of breeder deer that a deer breeder may
- 22 possess; [and]
- 23 (8) the dates for which a deer breeder permit is valid;
- 24 and
- 25 (9) the use of durable identification tags for
- 26 identifying breeder deer under this section.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
