2 relating to a study of the fiscal impact of adjusting the amount of

- 3 the ad valorem tax exemption to which disabled veterans and the
- 4 surviving spouses and children of disabled veterans and certain
- 5 members of the armed forces are entitled.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. (a) The comptroller of public accounts shall
- 8 study the fiscal impact on this state and local governments that
- 9 would have been created during the preceding 10 years by the
- 10 adjustment of the maximum amount of the exemption to which a person
- 11 is entitled under Section 11.22, Tax Code, to reflect the
- 12 percentage change from the preceding tax year in the average market
- 13 value of residence homesteads in the appraisal district in which
- 14 the property subject to the exemption is located.
- 15 (b) At the comptroller of public accounts' request, a state
- 16 agency or local government shall provide information and assistance
- 17 in conducting the study under this section.
- 18 (c) Not later than December 1, 2012, the comptroller of
- 19 public accounts shall report the results of the study conducted
- 20 under this section to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the
- 21 house of representatives, and the presiding officers of the
- 22 standing committees of each house of the legislature with primary
- 23 jurisdiction over matters affecting tax revenue and veterans
- 24 affairs.

6	Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
