- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 301.085, Labor Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 301.085. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION AND JOB MATCHING
- 8 SERVICES INFORMATION; OFFENSE; PENALTY.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 301.085, Labor Code, is amended by
- 10 amending Subsections (a), (c), and (d) and adding Subsection (b-1)
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (a) In this section:
- 13 (1) "Job matching services information" means
- 14 information in the records of the commission that pertains to the
- 15 commission's job matching services provided to employers and job
- 16 seekers through the Internet, workforce centers, or other means.
- 17 (2) "Unemployment [Tunemployment] compensation
- 18 information" means information in the records of the commission
- 19 that pertains to the administration of Subtitle A, including any
- 20 information collected, received, developed, or maintained in the
- 21 administration of unemployment compensation benefits or the
- 22 unemployment compensation tax system.
- 23 (b-1) The commission shall adopt and enforce reasonable
- 24 rules governing the confidentiality, custody, use, preservation,

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- 1 and disclosure of job matching services information. The rules
- 2 <u>must include safeguards to protect the confidentiality</u> of
- 3 <u>identifying information regarding any individual or any past or</u>
- 4 present employer or employing unit contained in job matching
- 5 services information, including any information that foreseeably
- 6 could be combined with other publicly available information to
- 7 reveal identifying information regarding the individual, employer,
- 8 or employing unit, as applicable.
- 9 (c) Unemployment compensation information and job matching
- 10 <u>services information are</u> [is] not public information for purposes
- 11 of Chapter 552, Government Code.
- 12 (d) Unless permitted by this subchapter or commission rule,
- 13 a person commits an offense if the person solicits, discloses,
- 14 receives, or uses, or authorizes, permits, participates in, or
- 15 acquiesces in another person's use of, unemployment compensation
- 16 information or job matching services information that reveals:
- 17 (1) identifying information regarding any individual
- 18 or past or present employer or employing unit; or
- 19 (2) information that foreseeably could be combined
- 20 with other publicly available information to reveal identifying
- 21 information regarding any individual or past or present employer or
- 22 employing unit.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
