- 4 SECTION 1. Section 901.153, Occupations Code, is amended by
- adding Subsection (f) to read as follows: 5
- 6 (f) An enforcement committee may hold a closed meeting to
- investigate and deliberate a disciplinary action under Subchapter K 7
- relating to the enforcement of this chapter or board rules as 8
- provided by Section 551.092, Government Code. 9
- 10 SECTION 2. Subsection (b), Section 901.457, Occupations
- Code, is amended to read as follows: 11
- 12 This section does not prohibit a license holder from
- 13 disclosing information that is required to be disclosed:
- 14 by the professional standards for reporting on the (1)
- 15 examination of a financial statement;
- under a summons or subpoena under the provisions 16

- 7 (5) $\left[\frac{(4)}{1}\right]$ in an ethical investigation conducted by a

- 12 SECTION 3. Section 901.601, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 13 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (a-1) to

- 15 (a) If it appears to the board that a person is engaging in
- 16 an act or practice that constitutes the practice of public
- 17 accountancy without a license under this chapter, the board, after
- 18 notice [and an opportunity for a hearing], may issue a cease and

- 20 <u>(a-1)</u> A person who is issued a cease and desist order under

- 6 Sec. 551.092. ENFORCEMENT COMMITTEE APPOINTED BY TEXAS
- 7 STATE BOARD OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTANCY. This chapter does not require an
- 8 enforcement committee appointed by the Texas State Board of Public
- 9 Accountancy to conduct an open meeting to investigate and
- 10 deliberate a disciplinary action under Subchapter K, Chapter 901,
- 11 Occupations Code, relating to the enforcement of Chapter 901 or the
- 12 rules of the Texas State Board of Public Accountancy.
- 13 SECTION 5. The following sections of the Occupations Code
- 14 are repealed:
- 15 (1) Subsection (c), Section 901.154; and
- 16 (2) Subsections (d) and (e), Section 901.308.
- 17 SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 18 901.308, Occupations Code, apply only to an examination
- 19 administered on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 20 examination administered before that date is governed by the law in
- 21 effect at the time the examination was administered, and the former
- 22 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 23 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
