BEGINNING TEACHER INDUCTION AND MENTORING PROGRAMS 1-16 21.651. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: Sec. BEGINNING TEACHER INDUCTION AND (a) To enable establishment of s 1-27 MENTORING 1-28 PROGRAM. sustainable district-wide high-quality beginning teacher induction and mentoring, the commissioner by rule shall establish a beginning 1-29 1-30 teacher induction and mentoring program under which school 1-31 districts may participate in accordance with local plans approved 1-32 by the commissioner that are based on guidelines adopted under this subchapter.
