## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to efficiencies and cost-savings in the health and human
- 3 services agencies and other related regulatory agencies.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any statute to the contrary, the
- 6 legislature, in its discretion, may determine the amount of each
- 7 appropriation of state funds. The amounts required by statute for
- 8 entities that receive state funds under the General Appropriations
- 9 Act, 82nd Legislature, Regular Session, 2011, may be reduced or
- 10 eliminated in order to achieve a balanced budget.
- 11 SECTION 2. All health and human services agencies shall
- 12 identify efficiencies and reduce expenditures by:
- 13 (1) Eliminating or modifying programs not funded or
- 14 funded at a reduced level through Article II of the General
- 15 Appropriations Act;
- 16 (2) Reviewing, updating, and modifying rules to
- 17 streamline functions while preserving care for consumers;
- 18 (3) Consolidating administrative and service
- 19 functions where applicable;
- 20 (4) Evaluating the sufficiency of existing fees to
- 21 cover costs associated with administering all applicable programs;
- 22 (5) Maximizing co-sharing, including co-payments, in
- 23 all programs;
- 24 (6) Expanding billing coordination to all programs;

- 1 (7) Renegotiating more efficient contracts;
- 2 (8) Evaluating regulatory requirements as they relate
- 3 to available resources;
- 4 (9) Requesting any waiver or authorization from a
- 5 federal agency determined to be necessary for implementation of any
- 6 initiative aimed at improving efficiency and reducing
- 7 expenditures;
- 8 (10) Increasing access to preventive primary care;
- 9 (11) Evaluating the state medical assistance and
- 10 children and child health plan programs; and
- 11 (12) Implementing additional initiatives identified
- 12 by the health and human services agencies.
- 13 SECTION 3. The Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 14 identify efficiencies and reduce expenditures by:
- 15 (1) Streamlining eligibility determination processes;
- 16 (2) Evaluating the elimination of Temporary
- 17 Assistance for Needy Families exemptions not required by federal
- 18 law; and
- 19 (3) Implementing additional initiatives identified by
- 20 the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 21 SECTION 4. The Department of Aging and Disability Services
- 22 shall identify efficiencies and reduce expenditures by:
- 23 (1) Evaluating the current forensic commitment
- 24 process to ensure that alleged offenders with an intellectual
- 25 disability are being served in the most appropriate and
- 26 cost-effective setting;
- 27 (2) Ensuring that clients are being served in the most

- 1 cost-effective Section 1915(c) waiver program appropriate for
- 2 their needs;
- 3 (3) Streamlining the administration and delivery of
- 4 services through Section 1915(c) waiver programs;
- 5 (4) Performing utilization management and review
- 6 activities for all community entitlement and Section 1915(c) waiver
- 7 programs;
- 8 (5) Increasing community based long term care service
- 9 delivery options while containing costs;
- 10 (6) Requiring clients of Section 1915(c) waiver
- 11 programs to access attendant services through community based
- 12 entitlement programs wherever possible; and
- 13 (7) Implementing additional initiatives identified by
- 14 the Department of Aging and Disability Services.
- 15 SECTION 5. The Department of Family and Protective Services
- 16 shall identify efficiencies and reduce expenditures by:
- 17 (1) Maximizing use of programs at the Department of
- 18 State Health Services to provide mental health and substance abuse
- 19 services that are purchased through the child protective services
- 20 program and adult protective services program;
- 21 (2) Creating efficiencies in child care regulation;
- 22 (3) Redesigning the foster care system with the goal
- 23 of improving outcomes for children and families; and
- 24 (4) Implementing additional initiatives identified by
- 25 the Department of Family and Protective Services.
- 26 SECTION 6. The Department of State Health Services shall
- 27 identify efficiencies and reduce expenditures by:

- 1 (1) Evaluating the current forensic commitment
- 2 process to ensure that alleged offenders with a mental illness are
- 3 being served in the most appropriate and cost-effective setting;
- 4 (2) Partnering with local health departments to
- 5 streamline public health efforts;
- 6 (3) Privatizing a state hospital;
- 7 (4) Utilizing residential units in state hospitals to
- 8 provide cost-effective care and to maintain bed capacity;
- 9 (5) Requiring hospitals, which accept the state
- 10 medical assistance program, to charge state mental health hospitals
- 11 no more than the state medical assistance program fee for service
- 12 rate;
- 13 (6) Expanding cost-effective models of care for mental
- 14 illness;
- 15 (7) Optimizing federal matching funds for all state
- 16 and local funding streams, including Trauma Funds;
- 17 (8) Managing expenditures for drugs provided through
- 18 the state mental health hospitals and community care settings; and
- 19 (9) Implementing additional initiatives identified by
- 20 the Department of State Health Services.
- 21 SECTION 7. The Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative
- 22 Services shall identify efficiencies and reduce expenditures by:
- 23 (1) Evaluating the feasibility and cost-effectiveness
- 24 of providing services to clients in the early childhood
- 25 intervention program through the state medical assistance and child
- 26 health plan programs; and
- 27 (2) Implementing additional initiatives identified by

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- 1 the Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services.
- 2 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
