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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to programs, services, and information related to women's health, family planning, and human sexuality. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. DEMONSTRATION PROJECT FOR WOMEN'S HEALTH CARE 5 SERVICES. Sections 32.0248(a) and (i), Human Resources Code, are 6 amended to read as follows: 7 (a) The department shall establish a <u>seven-year</u> [five-year] 8 9 demonstration project through the medical assistance program to expand access to preventive health and family planning services for 10 11 women. A woman eligible under Subsection (b) to participate in the 12 demonstration project may receive appropriate preventive health and family planning services, including: 13 14 (1) medical history recording and evaluation; 15 physical examinations; (2) 16 (3) health screenings, including screening for: (A) diabetes; 17 18 (B) cervical cancer; (C) 19 breast cancer; 20 sexually transmitted diseases; (D) 21 (E) hypertension; 22 cholesterol; and (F) 23 (G) tuberculosis; 24 (4) counseling and education on contraceptive methods

1 emphasizing the health benefits of abstinence from sexual activity 2 to recipients who are not married, except for counseling and 3 education regarding emergency contraception;

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4 (5) provision of contraceptives, except for the 5 provision of emergency contraception;

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(6) risk assessment; and

7 (7) referral of medical problems to appropriate 8 providers that are entities or organizations that do not perform or 9 promote elective abortions or contract or affiliate with entities 10 that perform or promote elective abortions.

11 (i) This section expires <u>December 31, 2013</u> [September 1, 12 2011].

SECTION 2. OUTREACH. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 531.095 to read as follows:

16 Sec. 531.095. IMPLEMENTATION OF MEASURES TO ACHIEVE 17 CASELOAD AND COST-SAVINGS ESTIMATES. (a) To attain the state and federal cost-savings and reduced rates of unintended pregnancies 18 estimated in the waiver application, or any renewal waiver 19 application, submitted to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid 20 Services for implementation of the demonstration project for 21 women's health care services authorized under Section 32.0248, 22 Human Resources Code, the commission shall implement effective 23 24 education, outreach, and other measures designed to increase participation in the demonstration project and through the 25 26 increased participation achieve the caseload and cost-savings estimates stated in the waiver application. 27

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1 (b) The commission, in complying with Subsection (a), may 2 not take any action to decrease the level of programs and services 3 designed to reduce the number of unintended pregnancies and lower 4 the rates of sexually transmitted diseases to below the level of 5 programs and services provided on September 1, 2011.

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(c) This section expires December 31, 2013.

SECTION 3. HUMAN SEXUALITY INSTRUCTION. Section 28.004,
Education Code, is amended by amending Subsections (e) and (i) and
adding Subsection (n) to read as follows:

10 (e) Any course materials and instruction relating to human 11 sexuality, sexually transmitted diseases, or human 12 immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome 13 shall be selected by the board of trustees with the advice of the 14 local school health advisory council and must:

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(1) be evidence-based;

16 (2) present abstinence from sexual activity as the 17 preferred choice of behavior in relationship to all sexual activity 18 for unmarried persons of school age;

19 <u>(3)</u> [<del>(2)</del>] devote more attention to abstinence from 20 sexual activity than to any other behavior;

21 (4) [(3)] emphasize that abstinence from sexual 22 activity, if used consistently and correctly, is the only method 23 that is 100 percent effective in preventing pregnancy, sexually 24 transmitted diseases, infection with human immunodeficiency virus, 25 [or] acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and the emotional trauma 26 associated with adolescent sexual activity;

27 (5) [(4)] direct adolescents to a standard of behavior

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1 in which abstinence from sexual activity before marriage is the 2 most effective way to prevent pregnancy, sexually transmitted 3 diseases, [and] infection with human immunodeficiency virus, and 4 [or] acquired immune deficiency syndrome; and

5 (6) [(5)] teach contraception and condom use in terms 6 of human use reality rates instead of theoretical laboratory rates, 7 if instruction on contraception and condoms is included in 8 curriculum content.

9 (i) Before each school year, a school district shall provide 10 written notice to a parent of each student enrolled in the district 11 of the board of trustees' decision regarding whether the district 12 will provide human sexuality instruction to district students. If 13 instruction will be provided, the notice must include:

(1) a summary of the basic content of the district's
human sexuality instruction to be provided to the student,
including a statement informing the parent <u>that the instruction is</u>
required by [of the instructional requirements under] state law to:
(A) present abstinence from sexual activity as
the preferred choice of behavior in relationship to all sexual
activity for unmarried persons of school age; and

21 (B) devote more attention to abstinence from 22 sexual activity than to any other behavior;

23 (2) a statement of whether the instruction is 24 considered by the district to be abstinence-only instruction or 25 comprehensive instruction, including an explanation of the 26 difference between those types of instruction and a specific 27 statement regarding whether the student will receive information on

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## 1 contraception and condom use;

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(3) [<del>(2)</del>] a statement of the parent's right to:

3 (A) review curriculum materials as provided by4 Subsection (j); and

5 (B) remove the student from any part of the 6 district's human sexuality instruction without subjecting the 7 student to any disciplinary action, academic penalty, or other 8 sanction imposed by the district or the student's school; and

9 <u>(4)</u> [<del>(3)</del>] information describing the opportunities 10 for parental involvement in the development of the curriculum to be 11 used in human sexuality instruction, including information 12 regarding the local school health advisory council established 13 under Subsection (a).

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(n) In this section:

15 (1) "Abstinence-only instruction" means instruction that does not include information about preventing pregnancy, 16 17 sexually transmitted diseases, infection with human immunodeficiency virus, or acquired immune deficiency syndrome 18 19 through any means other than total abstinence from sexual activity. (2) "Evidence-based" means information verified or 20 supported by research that is: 21 22 (A) conducted in compliance with accepted scientific methods; 23 24 (B) published in peer-reviewed journals, if 25 appropriate; 26 (C) recognized as medically accurate, objective, and complete by mainstream professional organizations and agencies 27

1 with expertise in the relevant field, including the federal Centers
2 for Disease Control and Prevention and the United States Department
3 of Health and Human Services; and
4 (D) proven through rigorous, scientific
5 evaluation to achieve positive outcomes on measures of sexual risk
6 behavior or its health consequences.

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7 SECTION 4. WAIVER. If before implementing any provision of 8 this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization 9 from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that 10 provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the 11 waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision 12 until the waiver or authorization is granted.

13 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September 14 1, 2011.
