A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to jurisdiction in certain proceedings brought by the 3 attorney general with respect to charitable trusts.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 123.005, Property Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

Sec. 123.005. BREACH 7 OF FIDUCIARY DUTY: VENUE; 8 JURISDICTION. (a) Venue in a proceeding brought by the attorney general alleging breach of a fiduciary duty by a charitable entity 9 10 or a fiduciary or managerial agent of a charitable trust shall be a court of competent jurisdiction in Travis County or in the county 11 12 where the defendant resides or has its principal office. To the 13 extent of a conflict between this subsection and any provision of the Texas Probate Code providing for venue of a proceeding brought 14 with respect to a charitable trust created by a will that has been 15 admitted to probate, this subsection controls. 16

17 (b) A statutory probate court of Travis County has 18 concurrent jurisdiction with any other court on which jurisdiction 19 is conferred by Section 4A, Texas Probate Code, in a proceeding 20 brought by the attorney general alleging breach of a fiduciary duty 21 with respect to a charitable trust created by a will that has been 22 admitted to probate.

23 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 24 to a proceeding commenced on or after the effective date of this

Act. A proceeding commenced before the effective date of this Act
is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective
date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that
purpose.

5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
