- 8 pathologist or audiologist, an applicant must:
- 9 (1) if the application is for a license in:
- 10 (A) speech-language pathology, possess at least
- 11 a master's degree with a major in at least one of the areas of
- 12 communicative sciences or disorders from a program accredited by \underline{a}
- 13 <u>national accrediting organization that is approved by the board and</u>
- 14 recognized by the United States secretary of education under the
- 15 Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. Section 1001 et seq.) [the
- 16 American Speech-Language-Hearing Association] in an accredited or
- 17 approved college or university; or
- 18 (B) audiology, possess at least a doctoral degree
- 19 <u>in audiology or a related hearing science from a program accredited</u>
- 20 by a national accrediting organization that is approved by the
- 21 board and recognized by the United States secretary of education
- 22 under the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. Section 1001 et
- 23 seq.) in an accredited or approved college or university;
- 24 (2) submit a transcript from a public or private

- 1 institution of higher learning showing successful completion of
- 2 course work in amounts set by the board in:
- 3 (A) normal development and use of speech,
- 4 language, and hearing;
- 5 (B) evaluation, habilitation, and rehabilitation
- 6 of speech, language, and hearing disorders; and
- 7 (C) related fields that augment the work of
- 8 clinical practitioners of speech-language pathology and audiology;
- 9 (3) have successfully completed at least 36 semester
- 10 hours in courses that are acceptable toward a graduate degree by the
- 11 college or university in which the courses are taken, at least 24 of
- 12 which must be in the professional area for which the license is
- 13 requested and at least six of which must be:
- 14 (A) in audiology if the application is for a
- 15 speech-language pathology license; or
- 16 (B) in speech-language pathology if the
- 17 application is for an audiology license;
- 18 (4) have completed the minimum number of hours,
- 19 established by the board, of supervised clinical experience with
- 20 persons who present a variety of communication disorders; and
- 21 (5) have completed the full-time supervised
- 22 professional experience, as defined by board rule, in which
- 23 clinical work has been accomplished in the major professional area
- 24 for which the license is being sought.
- SECTION 2. (a) Section 401.304, Occupations Code, as
- 26 amended by this Act, applies only to a person who applies for a
- 27 speech-language pathologist or audiologist license on or after the

- 2 before that date is governed by the law in effect immediately before
- 3 the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 4 effect for that purpose.
- 5 (b) A person who holds a license as an audiologist issued

- 7 license without complying with the change in law made by this Act to
- 8 Subsection (a), Section 401.304, Occupations Code.
