Sections 2306.554(a) and (b), Government Code, 13 are amended to read as follows: 14 (a) The board of directors of the corporation consists of five members appointed by the governor. Section 2306.559(d), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 13 14 (d) The report must include: 15 (1) a statement of support, revenue, and expenses and change in fund balances; 16 17 (2) a statement of functional expenses; [and] balance sheets for all funds; 18 (3) 19 (4) the number, amount, and purpose of private gifts, grants, donations, or other funds applied for and received; 20 21 (5) the number, amount, and purpose of loans provided to affordable housing developers, regardless of whether the 22 corporation provides those loans directly to the developers or 23 24 administers the loans from another source;

6	OR AGREEMENTS. A compliance contract or agreement between the

9	multifamily housing must contain a provision stating that if the			
10	housing sponsor fails to comply with the terms of the contract or			
11	agreement, the corporation may, at a minimum and as appropriate:

15	(3) withdraw reserve funds to make needed repairs and			
16	replacements to the property; or

10 (b) The corporation shall <u>make information available</u> 11 <u>describing its</u> [provide to the person filing the complaint and to 12 each person who is a subject of the complaint a copy of the 13 corporation's policies and] procedures <u>for</u> [relating to] complaint 14 investigation and resolution.

(c) The corporation[, at least quarterly until final disposition of the complaint,] shall periodically notify the [person filing the] complaint parties [and each person who is a subject of the complaint] of the status of the complaint until final disposition [investigation unless the notice would jeopardize an undercover investigation].

21 SECTION 8. Section 2306.5671, Government Code, as added by 22 this Act, does not affect the terms of a compliance contract or 23 agreement entered into before the effective date of this Act, 24 except that if the contract or agreement is renewed, modified, or 25 extended on or after the effective date of this Act, Section 26 2306.5671 applies to the contract or agreement beginning on the 27 date of renewal, modification, or extension.

1 SECTION 9. The change in law made by this Act relating to the qualifications for membership on the board of directors of the 2 Texas State Affordable Housing Corporation does not affect the 3 4 eligibility of a member of the board serving immediately before the effective date of this Act to continue to serve on the board for the 5 6 term to which the member was appointed. Not later than February 1, 2015, the governor shall appoint members of the board as necessary 7 8 to ensure that the composition of the board complies with Section 2306.554(a), Government Code, as amended by this Act. 9

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SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
