S.B. No. 684

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the transfer of the assets of and the dissolution of the
- 3 Fort Bend County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 6 (1) "City" means the City of Sugar Land.
- 7 (2) "District" means the Fort Bend County Water
- 8 Control and Improvement District No. 1.
- 9 SECTION 2. TRANSFER OF ASSETS AND DISSOLUTION OF DISTRICT.
- 10 (a) On the date the city council of the city passes a resolution
- 11 accepting the assets, debts, and contractual rights and obligations
- 12 of the district:
- 13 (1) all assets, debts, and contractual rights and
- 14 obligations of the district are property of the city; and
- 15 (2) the district is dissolved.
- 16 (b) On the date of the dissolution of the district, and
- 17 notwithstanding Section 51.790, Water Code, ownership of
- 18 Certificate of Adjudication No. 11-5170, including any attachments
- 19 or amendments to the certificate, transfers to the city.
- 20 (c) The city shall notify the Texas Commission on
- 21 Environmental Quality of the dissolution of the district and the
- 22 transfer of Certificate of Adjudication No. 11-5170 to the city.
- 23 (d) On receipt of notice under Subsection (c) of this
- 24 section, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality shall note

- 1 in its records that Certificate of Adjudication No. 11-5170 is
- 2 owned by the city. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality
- 3 shall, as a ministerial act, transfer the certificate to the city
- 4 without further application, notice, or hearing. A person, party,
- 5 or entity does not have any right of protest, objection, or
- 6 administrative review of the transfer prescribed by this Act.
- 7 (e) The transfer of Certificate of Adjudication No. 11-5170
- 8 to the city does not affect or impair the priority, extent,
- 9 validity, or purpose of the certificate.
- 10 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION OF ACT. This Act expires September 1,
- 11 2013.
- 12 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 13 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 14 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 15 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 16 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
