1-8 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-9 AN ACT

1-10 relating to the transfer of the assets of and the dissolution of the
1-11 Fort Bend County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1.

1-12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-13 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:

1-14 (1) "City" means the City of Sugar Land.

1-15 (2) "District" means the Fort Bend County Water
1-16 Control and Improvement District No. 1.

1-17 SECTION 2. TRANSFER OF ASSETS AND DISSOLUTION OF DISTRICT.

1-18 (a) On the date the city council of the city passes a resolution
1-19 accepting the assets, debts, and contractual rights and obligations
1-20 of the district:

1-21 (1) all assets, debts, and contractual rights and
1-22 obligations of the district are property of the city; and

1-23 (2) the district is dissolved.

1-24 (b) On the date of the dissolution of the district, and
1-25 notwithstanding Section 51.790, Water Code, ownership of
1-26 Certificate of Adjudication No. 11-5170, including any attachments
1-27 or amendments to the certificate, transfers to the city.

1-28 (c) The city shall notify the Texas Commission on
1-29 Environmental Quality of the dissolution of the district and the
1-30 transfer of Certificate of Adjudication No. 11-5170 to the city.

1-31 (d) On receipt of notice under Subsection (c) of this
1-32 section, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality shall note
1-33 in its records that Certificate of Adjudication No. 11-5170 is
1-34 owned by the city. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality
1-35 shall, as a ministerial act, transfer the certificate to the city
1-36 without further application, notice, or hearing. A person, party,
1-37 or entity does not have any right of protest, objection, or
1-38 administrative review of the transfer prescribed by this Act.

1-39 (e) The transfer of Certificate of Adjudication No. 11-5170
1-40 to the city does not affect or impair the priority, extent,
1-41 validity, or purpose of the certificate.

1-42 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION OF ACT. This Act expires September 1,
1-43 2013.

1-44 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
1-45 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
1-46 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
1-47 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
1-48 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
