- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "committee" means the 5
- State Budgeting Plan Legislative Advisory Committee established
- 7 under Section 2 of this Act.
- SECTION 2. ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF STATE BUDGETING 8
- PLAN LEGISLATIVE ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The State Budgeting Plan
- Legislative Advisory Committee is composed of 17 members as 10
- 11 follows:

- 12 (1)the chair and vice chair of the Senate Committee on
- 13 Finance;
- 14 (2) the chair of the House Appropriations Committee;
- (3) the chair of the House Ways and Means Committee; 15
- one public member appointed by the lieutenant 16 (4)
- 17 governor;
- 18 one public member appointed by the speaker of the
- house of representatives; and 19
- 11 members appointed by the governor, as follows: 20
- 21 (A) three selected from a list of 10 names of
- 22 persons recommended by the Metro 8 Chambers of Commerce;
- 23 (B) one selected from a list of five names of
- 24 persons recommended by the Texas Medical Association;

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- 1 (C) one selected from a list of five names of
- 2 persons recommended by the Texas Hospital Association;
- 3 (D) one selected from a list of five names of
- 4 persons recommended by the Texas Association of School Boards;
- 5 (E) one selected from a list of five names of
- 6 persons recommended by the Texas affiliate of the American
- 7 Federation of Teachers (Texas AFT);
- 8 (F) one selected from a list of five names of
- 9 persons recommended by the United Ways of Texas;
- 10 (G) one selected from a list of five names of
- 11 persons recommended as follows:
- 12 (i) one by the Texas Public Employees
- 13 Association;
- 14 (ii) one by the Texas State Employees
- 15 Union;
- 16 (iii) one by the Department of Public
- 17 Safety Officers Association;
- 18 (iv) one by the American Federation of
- 19 State, County and Municipal Employees; and
- 20 (v) one by the Retired State Employees
- 21 Association; and
- 22 (H) two persons the governor determines are
- 23 appropriate.
- (b) Each entity specified by Subsection (a)(6) of this
- 25 section to recommend a person or persons for consideration for an
- 26 appointment shall make the recommendation not later than October 1,
- 27 2011.

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- 1 (c) A person specified by Subsection (a) of this section to
- 2 appoint a committee member shall make the appointment not later
- 3 than November 1, 2011.
- 4 (d) The governor shall select one member of the committee to
- 5 serve as the chair and another member to serve as the vice chair.
- 6 (e) The committee shall meet at the call of the chair.
- 7 (f) A committee member may not receive compensation for
- 8 serving on the committee but is entitled to reimbursement of travel
- 9 expenses incurred by the member while conducting the business of
- 10 the committee as provided by the General Appropriations Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. STATE BUDGETING PLAN. (a) The committee shall
- 12 develop a comprehensive state budgeting plan consisting of
- 13 recommended state budgeting guidelines and processes the
- 14 implementation of which are anticipated to foster this state's
- 15 current and long-term economic health. At a minimum, the plan must
- 16 provide guidelines and processes designed to:
- 17 (1) eliminate diversions of revenue realized from the
- 18 taxes imposed by Chapter 162, Tax Code, from uses other than the
- 19 construction and maintenance of roads and other transportation
- 20 systems;
- 21 (2) eliminate diversions of other state revenue from
- 22 the purposes for which the revenue is dedicated by law to general
- 23 governmental purposes through the operation of Section 403.095,
- 24 Government Code, or other mechanisms;
- 25 (3) address and eliminate, to the extent possible, the
- 26 structural state budget deficit created by the fiscal decisions
- 27 made in 2006 during the special session of the 79th Legislature;

- 1 (4) employ budget practices and initiatives and
- 2 investment strategies the implementation of which would leverage
- 3 all available funds and increase resources coming to this state
- 4 from outside of this state;
- 5 (5) facilitate making investments that are vital to
- 6 this state's immediate and future economic health and provide
- 7 options for paying for those investments without unnecessarily or
- 8 excessively burdening taxpayers and residents of this state; and
- 9 (6) modify and update budgeting practices to ensure
- 10 that legislation and other initiatives offering significant
- 11 potential for economic development and growth in this state's tax
- 12 base are not hindered by legislative rules and practices regarding
- 13 the types of legislation that may be considered and enacted by the
- 14 legislature.
- 15 (b) The committee shall hold public hearings at locations
- 16 throughout this state to hear testimony regarding the issues to be
- 17 addressed in the state budgeting plan.
- 18 SECTION 4. SUBMISSION OF STATE BUDGETING PLAN. (a) The
- 19 committee shall submit the state budgeting plan developed under
- 20 Section 3 of this Act to the Senate Finance Committee, the House
- 21 Appropriations Committee, and the Legislative Budget Board not
- 22 later than June 1, 2012.
- 23 (b) The Senate Finance Committee and the House
- 24 Appropriations Committee shall consider the state budgeting
- 25 guidelines and processes recommended in the state budgeting plan in
- 26 developing proposed state budgets for the state fiscal biennium
- 27 beginning September 1, 2013, and future state fiscal bienniums.

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- 1 SECTION 5. ABOLITION OF COMMITTEE. The committee is
- 2 abolished September 1, 2013.
- 3 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 4 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 5 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 6 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 7 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
