6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 132, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 132.024 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 132.024. STUDENT INFORMATION; OFFENSE; PENALTY. (a)
9	<pre>In this section:</pre>
10	(1) "Student" means any prospective, current, or
11	<pre>former student of:</pre>
12	(A) a career school or college; or
13	(B) any other school, educational institution,
14	or business entity from which the commission receives, or regarding
15	which the commission reviews, information through its
16	administration or enforcement of this chapter.
17	(2) "Student information" means identifying
18	information in the commission's possession regarding a student.
19	The term includes:
20	(A) a student's name, address, telephone number,
21	social security number, e-mail address, or date of birth;
22	(B) any other identifying number or other
23	information that foreseeably could be combined with other publicly
24	available information to reveal identifying information regarding

- 2 (C) a student's education records, as defined by
- 3 <u>34 C.F.R. Section 99.3.</u>
- 4 (b) Student information is not public information for
- 5 purposes of Chapter 552, Government Code.
- 6 (c) Unless permitted by Subchapter F, Chapter 301, Labor
- 7 Code, or commission rule, a person commits an offense if the person
- 8 solicits, discloses, receives, or uses, or authorizes, permits,
- 9 participates in, or acquiesces in another person's use of, student
- 10 <u>information</u>.
- 11 (d) An offense under Subsection (c) is a Class A
- 12 <u>misdemeanor</u>.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
