A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to eligibility of certain job trainees for extended
- 3 unemployment compensation benefits.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 209.041, Labor Code, is amended to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 Sec. 209.041. ELIGIBILITY FOR EXTENDED BENEFITS. (a) An
- 8 individual is eligible to receive extended benefits for a benefit
- 9 period of unemployment in the individual's eligibility period if,
- 10 with respect to the benefit period, the individual:
- 11 (1) has exhausted all regular benefits;
- 12 (2) satisfies the requirements of this subtitle for
- 13 the receipt of regular benefits that are applicable to an
- 14 individual claiming extended benefits, including not being
- 15 disqualified for the receipt of benefits; and
- 16 (3) has within the individual's base period received
- 17 benefit wage credits for employment by employers in an amount not
- 18 less than:
- 19 (A) 40 times the individual's weekly benefit
- 20 amount; or
- (B) 1-1/2 times the individual's high-quarter
- 22 benefit wage credits.
- (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), an individual is also
- 24 eligible to receive extended benefits for a benefit period of

- 1 unemployment in the individual's eligibility period as provided by
- 2 Subchapter F.
- 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 209, Labor Code, is amended by adding
- 4 Subchapter F to read as follows:
- 5 SUBCHAPTER F. EXTENDED BENEFITS FOR CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS ENROLLED
- 6 IN CERTAIN TRAINING PROGRAMS
- 7 Sec. 209.101. ELIGIBILITY FOR EXTENDED BENEFITS.
- 8 Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, an individual
- 9 is entitled to extended benefits as provided by this subchapter if
- 10 the individual:
- 11 (1) is unemployed;
- 12 (2) has exhausted all regular benefits; and
- 13 (3) is enrolled in, and making satisfactory progress
- 14 toward completion of, a commission-approved training program under
- 15 Section 207.022 or a job training program under the Workforce
- 16 Investment Act of 1998 (29 U.S.C. Section 2801 et seq.) designed to
- 17 prepare individuals who have been separated from a declining
- 18 occupation or who have been involuntarily and indefinitely
- 19 separated from employment as a result of a permanent reduction of
- 20 operations at the individual's place of employment.
- Sec. 209.102. DURATION AND AMOUNT OF EXTENDED BENEFITS.
- 22 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, an
- 23 <u>eligible individual under Section 209.101 is entitled to receive</u>
- 24 extended benefits under this subchapter until the earlier of:
- 25 (1) the date the individual completes the training
- 26 program; or
- 27 (2) the expiration of 26 additional benefit periods.

- 1 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter,
- 2 the weekly amount of extended benefits payable to an eligible
- 3 <u>individual under Section 209.101</u> is an amount equal to the
- 4 individual's average weekly benefit amount for the most recent
- 5 benefit year.
- 6 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 7 to a claim for extended unemployment compensation benefits filed
- 8 with the Texas Workforce Commission on or after the effective date
- 9 of this Act. A claim filed before the effective date of this Act is
- 10 governed by the law in effect on the date the claim was filed, and
- 11 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
