SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 3-22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 3-23 3-24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 3-25 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
