5	SECTION 1. Chapter 106, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended
6	by adding Section 106.042 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 106.042. PRESENCE OF MINOR ON CERTAIN PREMISES. (a) A
8	minor commits an offense if the minor enters and remains on a
9	premises covered by a late hours license or permit. An offense
10	under this subsection is punishable as provided by Section 106.071.
11	(b) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under
12	Subsection (a) that:
13	(1) the minor is:
14	(A) lawfully employed by the license or permit
15	holder or otherwise engaged in the minor's lawful employment on the
16	premises; or
17	(B) accompanied by the minor's adult parent,
18	guardian, or spouse or is otherwise under adult supervision; or
19	(2) the premises is covered by a food and beverage
20	certificate and the minor does not enter and remain in the bar area
21	of the premises.
22	(c) A license or permit holder that allows a minor to enter
23	and remain on the licensed or permitted premises in violation of
24	this section commits an offense. An offense under this subsection

2 SECTION 2. Section 106.071(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

4 (a) This section applies to an offense under Section 106.02,
5 106.025, 106.04, <u>106.042(a)</u>, 106.05, or 106.07.

6 SECTION 3. Section 106.13(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:

8 (a) Except as provided in Subsections (b) and (c) of this 9 section, the commission or administrator may cancel or suspend for 10 not more than 90 days a retail license or permit or a private club 11 registration permit if it is found, on notice and hearing, that the 12 licensee or permittee with criminal negligence:

13 (1) sold, served, dispensed, or delivered an alcoholic
 14 beverage to a minor <u>on the licensed or permitted premises;</u>

15 (2) [or with criminal negligence] permitted a minor to 16 violate Section 106.04 or 106.05 [of this code] on the licensed or 17 permitted premises; or

18 (3) allowed a minor to enter and remain on the licensed
19 or permitted premises in violation of Section 106.042.
