A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to assistance provided by the Office of Public Utility 2 3 Counsel to interested parties on certain electricity matters 4 involving certificates of convenience and necessity. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 13.003, Utilities Code, 6 is amended to read as follows: 7 (a) The office: 8 (1) shall assess the effect of utility rate changes 9 10 and other regulatory actions on residential consumers in this 11 state; 12 (2)shall advocate in the office's own name a position 13 determined by the counsellor to be most advantageous to a substantial number of residential consumers; 14 15 (3) may appear or intervene, as a party or otherwise, as a matter of right on behalf of: 16 residential consumers, as a class, in any 17 (A) proceeding before the commission, including an alternative dispute 18 resolution proceeding; and 19 (B) small commercial consumers, as a class, in 20 any proceeding in which the counsellor determines that small 21 22 commercial consumers are in need of representation, including an alternative dispute resolution proceeding; 23 24 (4) may initiate or intervene as a matter of right or

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1 otherwise appear in a judicial proceeding:

2 (A) that involves an action taken by an 3 administrative agency in a proceeding, including an alternative 4 dispute resolution proceeding, in which the counsellor is 5 authorized to appear; or

6 (B) in which the counsellor determines that 7 residential electricity consumers or small commercial electricity 8 consumers are in need of representation;

9 (5) is entitled to the same access as a party, other 10 than commission staff, to records gathered by the commission under 11 Section 14.204;

12 (6) is entitled to discovery of any nonprivileged 13 matter that is relevant to the subject matter of a proceeding or 14 petition before the commission;

15 (7) may represent an individual residential or small 16 commercial consumer with respect to the consumer's disputed 17 complaint concerning utility services that is unresolved before the 18 commission; [and]

19 (8) may recommend legislation to the legislature that 20 the office determines would positively affect the interests of 21 residential and small commercial consumers; and

22 (9) may advise persons who are interested parties for 23 purposes of Section 37.054 on procedural matters related to 24 proceedings before the commission on an application for a 25 certificate of convenience and necessity filed under Section 26 <u>37.053</u>.

27 SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 37.054, Utilities Code,

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is amended to read as follows: 1

(a) When an application for a certificate is filed, the 2 commission shall: 3

4 (1)give notice of the application to interested parties and to the office; and 5

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(2) if requested:

(B)

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set a time and place for a hearing; and (A) give notice of the hearing.

9 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act to Section 37.054, Utilities Code, applies only to an application for a 10 certificate of convenience and necessity filed on or after the 11 effective date of this Act. An application for a certificate of 12 convenience and necessity filed before the effective date of this 13 Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the application was 14 15 filed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

16 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2011. 20

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
