S.B. No. 860

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to the authority of the El Paso County Hospital District to 2 3 appoint, contract for, or employ physicians, dentists, and other 4 health care providers. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 281, Health and Safety 6 7 Code, is amended by adding Section 281.0285 to read as follows: 8 Sec. 281.0285. EL PASO COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT; EMPLOYMENT OF PHYSICIANS, DENTISTS, AND OTHER HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS. (a) The 9 10 board of the El Paso County Hospital District may appoint, contract for, or employ physicians, dentists, and other health care 11 providers as the board considers necessary for the efficient 12 operation of the district. 13 (b) The term of an employment contract entered into under 14 this section may not exceed four years. 15 (c) This section may not be construed as authorizing the 16 17 board of the El Paso County Hospital District to supervise or control the practice of medicine as prohibited by Subtitle B, Title 18 3, Occupations Code, or to supervise or control the practice of 19 dentistry as prohibited by Subtitle D, Title 3, Occupations Code. 20 21 (d) The authority granted to the board of the El Paso County 22 Hospital District under Subsection (a) to employ physicians shall apply as necessary for the district to fulfill the district's 23 24 statutory mandate to provide medical care for the indigent and

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1	needy residents of the district as provided by Section 281.046.
2	(e) The medical executive committee of the El Paso County
3	Hospital District, in accordance with the bylaws adopted by the
4	board of the El Paso County Hospital District, shall adopt,
5	maintain, and enforce policies to ensure that a physician employed
6	by the district exercises the physician's independent medical
7	judgment in providing care to patients.
8	(f) The policies adopted by the medical executive committee
9	under this section must include:
10	(1) policies relating to:
11	(A) governance of the medical executive
12	<pre>committee;</pre>
13	(B) credentialing;
14	(C) quality assurance;
15	(D) utilization review;
16	(E) peer review;
17	(F) medical decision-making; and
18	(G) due process; and
19	(2) rules requiring the disclosure of financial
20	conflicts of interest by a member of the medical executive
21	<u>committee.</u>
22	(g) The medical executive committee and the board of the El
23	Paso County Hospital District shall jointly develop and implement a
24	conflict management process to resolve any conflict between the
25	policies adopted under this section and a policy of the El Paso
26	County Hospital District.
27	(h) A member of the medical executive committee who is a

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1	physician shall provide biennially to the chair of the medical
2	executive committee a signed, verified statement indicating that
3	the committee member:
4	(1) is licensed by the Texas Medical Board;
5	(2) will exercise independent medical judgment in all
6	medical executive committee matters, including matters relating
7	<u>to:</u>
8	(A) credentialing;
9	(B) quality assurance;
10	(C) utilization review;
11	(D) peer review;
12	(E) medical decision-making; and
13	(F) due process;
14	(3) will exercise the committee member's best efforts
15	to ensure compliance with the policies that are adopted or
16	established by the medical executive committee; and
17	(4) will report immediately to the Texas Medical Board
18	any action or event that the committee member reasonably and in good
19	faith believes constitutes a compromise of the independent medical
20	judgment of a physician in caring for a patient.
21	(i) For all matters relating to the practice of medicine,
22	each physician employed by the El Paso County Hospital District
23	shall ultimately report to the chair of the medical executive
24	committee for the district.
25	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
26	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
