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       SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 281, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Section 281.0285 to read as follows:
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                Sec. 281.0285. EL PASO COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT; EMPLOYMENT
       OF PHYSICIANS, DENTISTS, AND OTHER HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS. (a) The
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        board of the El Paso County Hospital District may appoint, contract
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       for, or employ physicians, dentists, and other health care providers as the board considers necessary for the efficient
        operation of the district.
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               (b) The term of an employment contract entered into under
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        this section may not exceed four years.
       (c) This section may not be construed as authorizing the board of the El Paso County Hospital District to supervise or
