8	(a) In this section, "homeless individual":
9	(1) means an individual who:
10	(A) lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate

12	(B) has a primary nighttime residence that is:
13	(i) a supervised publicly or privately
14	operated shelter designed to provide temporary living
15	accommodations, including welfare hotels, congregate shelters, and

- temporary residence for individuals 18 intended to be

- (iii) a public or private place not 20

- 1 (b) Except as provided by Subsections (e) and (g), a
