S.B. No. 904

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the eligibility of certain citizens residing outside
- 3 the United States to vote a full ballot.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 101.001, Election Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 101.001. ELIGIBILITY. (a) A person is eligible for
- 8 early voting by mail as provided by this chapter if:
- 9 (1) the person is qualified to vote in this state or,
- 10 if not registered to vote in this state, would be qualified if
- 11 registered; and
- 12 (2) the person is:
- (A) a member of the armed forces of the United
- 14 States, or the spouse or a dependent of a member;
- 15 (B) a member of the merchant marine of the United
- 16 States, or the spouse or a dependent of a member; or
- 17 (C) domiciled in this state but temporarily
- 18 living outside the territorial limits of the United States and the
- 19 District of Columbia.
- 20 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a) and Chapter 114, a
- 21 person who indicates on a federal postcard application that the
- 22 person is a United States citizen residing outside the United
- 23 States indefinitely is entitled to vote a full ballot as provided by
- 24 this chapter if the person is otherwise eligible to vote under this

- 1 chapter and is a registered voter at the address contained on the
- 2 application.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 101.004, Election Code, is amended by
- 4 adding Subsection (n) to read as follows:
- 5 (n) The early voting clerk shall provide notice to a person
- 6 who indicates on a federal postcard application that the person is a
- 7 United States citizen residing outside the United States
- 8 indefinitely, other than a person described by Section 101.001(b),
- 9 that as a result of the person's indication, the person is only
- 10 eligible to vote a federal ballot as provided by Chapter 114. The
- 11 secretary of state shall prescribe the form and manner of the notice
- 12 provided under this subsection.
- 13 SECTION 3. Chapter 101, Election Code, is amended by adding
- 14 Section 101.014 to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 101.014. NOTICE ON COUNTY WEBSITE FOR CITIZENS
- 16 RESIDING OUTSIDE OF UNITED STATES INDEFINITELY. If a county
- 17 <u>maintains an Internet website to provide information on voting, the</u>
- 18 website must include information that describes the effects on the
- 19 ballot a person will receive under state law if the person indicates
- 20 on a federal postcard application that the person is a United States
- 21 citizen residing outside the United States indefinitely.
- SECTION 4. Section 114.002, Election Code, is amended to
- 23 read as follows:
- Sec. 114.002. ELIGIBILITY. A United States citizen
- 25 residing [dwelling] outside the United States is eligible to vote a
- 26 federal ballot by mail if:
- 27 (1) the citizen's most recent domicile in the United

- 1 States was in this state and the <u>citizen</u> is residing outside the
- 2 United States indefinitely [citizen's intent to return to this
- 3 state is uncertain];
- 4 (2) the citizen would be eligible for registration as
- 5 a voter in this state if a resident; and
- 6 (3) the citizen is not eligible to vote on federal
- 7 offices in any other state.
- 8 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
- 9 federal postcard application that requests a ballot for an election
- 10 that is held on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
