- 6 SECTION 1. Section 402.006, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 8 <u>(d) The attorney general may charge and collect a</u>
- 9 nonrefundable administrative convenience fee for the electronic
- 10 submission of a document to the attorney general. The fee
- 11 <u>authorized</u> by this section is in addition to any other fee the
- 12 attorney general may assess. The attorney general may adopt rules
- 13 <u>necessary to administer this subsection.</u> This subsection expires
- 14 <u>September 1, 2015.</u>

- 15 SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 552, Government Code, is
- 16 amended by adding Section 552.309 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 552.309. TIMELINESS OF ACTION BY ELECTRONIC
- 18 SUBMISSION. (a) When this subchapter requires a request, notice,
- 19 or other document to be submitted or otherwise given to the attorney
- 20 general within a specified period, the requirement is met in a
- 21 <u>timely fashion if the document is submitted to the attorney general</u>
- 22 through the attorney general's designated electronic filing system
- 23 within that period.
- 24 (b) The attorney general may electronically transmit a

- 1 notice, decision, or other document. When this subchapter requires
- 2 the attorney general to deliver a notice, decision, or other
- 3 document within a specified period, the requirement is met in a
- 4 timely fashion if the document is electronically transmitted by the
- 5 attorney general within that period.
- 6 (c) This section does not affect the right of a person or
- 7 governmental body to submit information to the attorney general
- 8 under Section 552.308.
- 9 SECTION 3. The fee prescribed by Subsection (d), Section
- 10 402.006, Government Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a
- 11 document electronically submitted to the office of the attorney
- 12 general on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
