## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Section 402.006, Government Code, is amended by 6
- 7 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- (d) The attorney general may charge and collect a 8
- 9 nonrefundable administrative convenience fee for the electronic
- submission of a document to the attorney general. The fee 10
- authorized by this section is in addition to any other fee the 11
- attorney general may assess. The attorney general may adopt rules 12
- necessary to administer this subsection. This subsection expires 13
- September 1, 2015. 14

- SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 552, Government Code, is 15
- amended by adding Section 552.309 to read as follows: 16
- Sec. 552.309. TIMELINESS OF ACTION BY ELECTRONIC 17
- SUBMISSION. (a) When this subchapter requires a request, notice, 18
- or other document to be submitted or otherwise given to the attorney 19
- general within a specified period, the requirement is met in a 20
- timely fashion if the document is submitted to the attorney general 21
- through the attorney general's designated electronic filing system 22
- 23 within that period.
- 24 (b) The attorney general may electronically transmit a

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- 1 <u>notice</u>, <u>decision</u>, <u>or other document</u>. When this <u>subchapter requires</u>
- 2 the attorney general to deliver a notice, decision, or other
- 3 document within a specified period, the requirement is met in a
- 4 timely fashion if the document is electronically transmitted by the
- 5 attorney general within that period.
- 6 (c) This section does not affect the right of a person or
- 7 governmental body to submit information to the attorney general
- 8 under Section 552.308.
- 9 SECTION 3. The fee prescribed by Section 402.006(d),
- 10 Government Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a document
- 11 electronically submitted to the office of the attorney general on
- 12 or after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
