- 4 (d) Not later than December 1, 2012, the Texas Commission on
- 5 Environmental Quality and the agency shall complete the study
- 6 required by this section and submit a report containing the
- 7 findings of the study to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and
- 8 <u>each member of the legislature.</u>
- 9 (e) This section expires January 1, 2013.
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
