2	relating to authorizing a public junior college to award an
3	associate degree to a student enrolled in a four-year public
4	institution of higher education who previously attended the junior

6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter S, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
8	amended by adding Section 61.833 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 61.833. CREDIT TRANSFER FOR ASSOCIATE DEGREE. (a)
10	This section applies to a student enrolled in a general academic
11	teaching institution who:

- 12 (1) transferred to the institution from or previously
- 13 attended a public junior college;
- (2) earned at least 30 credit hours for course work
- 15 successfully completed at the public junior college; and
- 16 (3) has earned a cumulative total of at least 90 credit
- 17 hours for course work successfully completed.
- 18 (b) As soon as practicable after a student who is enrolled
- 19 <u>in a general academic teaching institution has met the criteria</u>
- 20 established by Subsection (a)(3), the institution by e-mail or
- 21 other reasonable method shall request authorization from the
- 22 student for the institution to release the student's transcript to
- 23 the public junior college that the student previously attended for
- 24 the purpose of determining whether the student has earned the

- 1 credits required for an associate degree awarded by the junior
- 2 college. On receipt of a student's authorization under this
- 3 subsection, the institution shall release the student's transcript
- 4 to the public junior college.
- 5 (c) After receiving a student transcript from a general
- 6 academic teaching institution under Subsection (b), a public junior
- 7 college shall review the transcript and, if the public junior
- 8 college determines the student has earned the credits required to
- 9 receive an associate degree awarded by the junior college, may
- 10 award the student the degree.
- 11 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
- 12 student who not earlier than the 2011 fall semester transfers to or
- 13 otherwise initially enrolls in a general academic teaching
- 14 institution after attending a public junior college.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
