- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 155.003(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- to read as follows: 7
- (a) To be eligible for a license under this chapter, an 8
- 9 applicant must present proof satisfactory to the board that the
- 10 applicant:

- 11 (1)is at least 21 years of age;
- 12 (2) is of good professional character and has not
- violated Section 164.051, 164.052, or 164.053; 13
- 14 (3) has completed:
- at least 60 semester 15 (A) hours of
- 16 courses, other than courses in medical school, that are acceptable
- to The University of Texas at Austin for credit on a bachelor of 17
- arts degree or a bachelor of science degree; 18
- (B) the 19 entire primary, secondary, and
- premedical education required in the country of medical school 20
- graduation, if the medical school is located outside the United 21
- 22 States or Canada; or
- 23 (C) substantially equivalent courses as
- 24 determined by board rule;

- 1 (4) is a graduate of a medical school located in the
- 2 United States or Canada and approved by the board;
- 3 (5) has either:
- 4 (A) successfully completed one year of graduate
- 5 medical training approved by the board in the United States or
- 6 Canada; or
- 7 (B) graduated from a medical school located
- 8 outside the United States or Canada and has successfully completed
- 9 two [three] years of graduate medical training approved by the
- 10 board in the United States or Canada;
- 11 (6) has passed an examination accepted or administered
- 12 by the board; and
- 13 (7) has passed a Texas medical jurisprudence
- 14 examination as determined by board rule.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 155.004, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 155.004. ADDITIONAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR
- 18 GRADUATES OF CERTAIN FOREIGN MEDICAL SCHOOLS. A license applicant
- 19 who is a graduate of a medical school that is located outside the
- 20 United States and Canada must present proof satisfactory to the
- 21 board that the applicant:
- 22 (1) is a graduate of a school whose curriculum meets
- 23 the requirements for an unapproved medical school as determined by
- 24 a committee of experts selected by the Texas Higher Education
- 25 Coordinating Board;
- 26 (2) has successfully completed $[\div]$
- 27 [(A) at least three years of graduate medical

- 1 training in the United States or Canada that was approved by the
- 2 board; or
- 3 [(B)] at least two years of graduate medical
- 4 training in the United States or Canada that was approved by the
- 5 board [and at least one year of graduate medical training outside
- 6 the United States or Canada that was approved for advanced standing
- 7 by a specialty board organization approved by the board];
- 8 (3) holds a valid certificate issued by the
- 9 Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates; and
- 10 (4) is able to communicate in English.
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 155.005(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 (a) To be eligible for a license under this chapter, an
- 14 applicant who has been a student of a foreign medical school must
- 15 present proof satisfactory to the board that the applicant:
- 16 (1) meets the requirements of Section 155.003;
- 17 (2) has studied medicine in a medical school located
- 18 outside the United States and Canada that is acceptable to the
- 19 board;
- 20 (3) has completed all of the didactic work of the
- 21 foreign medical school but has not graduated from the school;
- 22 (4) has attained a score satisfactory to a medical
- 23 school in the United States approved by the Liaison Committee on
- 24 Medical Education on a qualifying examination and has
- 25 satisfactorily completed one academic year of supervised clinical
- 26 training for foreign medical students, as defined by the American
- 27 Medical Association Council on Medical Education (Fifth Pathway

- 1 Program), under the direction of the medical school in the United
- 2 States;
- 3 (5) has attained a passing score on the Educational
- 4 Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates examination or another
- 5 examination, if required by the board;
- 6 (6) has successfully completed at least <u>two</u> [three]
- 7 years of graduate medical training in the United States or Canada
- 8 that was approved by the board as of the date the training was
- 9 completed; and
- 10 (7) has passed the license examination under
- 11 Subchapter B required by the board of each applicant.
- 12 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 13 155.003, 155.004, and 155.005, Occupations Code, apply only to an
- 14 application for a license to practice medicine submitted to the
- 15 Texas Medical Board on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 16 application for a license submitted before that date is governed by
- 17 the law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and the
- 18 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
